Mayor Hardin reported that there was only one complaint about fireworks this year. She also wanted to mention that the rules for driving a golf cart in town were that you have to be 16 years old and a licensed driver. There is a tree on city property that needs to come down and she would like to get bids for this. Insurance is a requirement and a start date with a deadline is also needed. Mayor Hardin also mentioned that Mangler is working on updating the employee handbook and that the part-time maintenance hours have been moved back to the original hours.

Gerlach reported that he has possibly found a city truck but is waiting on follow-up from dealership.

Frett mentioned that there are still issues with semis and cars parking on the railroad right of way. Daryl will order another sign for both sides of road.

Mangler questioned the feasibility of disc golf and would like the city insurance checked regarding liability.
