Reports:

Dan reported that the city has purchased a Polaris to replace the 1993 Kawasaki Mule. He will be advertising the Mule for sale in the next week. He also mentioned that the fire station signs are in and will be installing them. He brought to the council's attention that the water meters in town will need to be replaced in the next few years due to regulation changes by the FCC.

Seth reported that everything seems to be running smoothly. He submitted bills from Kline and MVP for work that has been done in the past month regarding the sewer issues.

James reported that the alarm system at the well needs to be replaced and is working on getting pricing for the council. He inquired on the status of power washing the tower, and the council decided to hold off until the quotes came in for the alarm system.

Mayor Hardin brought up having American flags available for the residents of Delmar to honor the patriotic holidays. This would be a yearly fee to the residents who would like to participate. She would also like the new city attorney to attend a council meeting in the near future.

Gerlach asked that when there is a snow storm, that Dan push the snow back farther than what he has been doing.

Frett reported that it appears that there are two campers in town that are being lived in. This goes against city ordinance and will be addressed promptly.
