Delmar Spring Clean-Up will be May 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>. Hours are Friday 8-6 and Saturday 8-5. No electronics will be accepted this year.

#### Reports

Mayor Hardin reported that the Delmar Development will be placing 2 dog bag receptacles in the park and at the depot. She mentioned that dumping will not be allowed up at the water tower until the County Shed is built.

Brad mentioned that the Ranger truck box is rusted out and will need to be replaced.

Seth reported that the fence around the lagoon will need to be replaced as well as additional gravel added to the driveway.

Gerlach and Mangler both had thoughts/concerns on the frisbee golf that has opened. The council will monitor this.
