Omicron Phi Zeta Chapter and Women of the Dove Foundation Theresa Drakeford Memorial Book Scholarship

On January 16, 1920, Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated was founded on the campus of Howard University by five visionary women who dared to depart from the traditional coalitions for black women and sought to establish a new organization based on the precepts of Scholarship, Service, Sisterhood and Finer Womanhood.

In furtherance of the vision of the founders, Omicron Phi Zeta Chapter was chartered on March 26, 1994. Since its chartering 30 years ago, Omicron Phi Zeta chapter members have supported a variety of causes and organizations, in addition to the Sorority's national initiatives. Omicron Phi Zeta is an award-winning chapter for its commitment to Z-HOPE (Zetas Helping Other People Excel) projects, involvement with its youth auxiliary and Undergraduate Chapter, Xi Sigma at The George Washington University.

The Women of the Dove Foundation (WDF) is the 501(c)3 organization that partners with Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated, Omicron Phi Zeta Chapter. WDF is dedicated to improving the quality of life for individuals and families in local, national, and global communities. Every year, the foundation sponsors events to raise funds for WDF scholarships and other charitable causes.

We are pleased to announce the **2024** Theresa Drakeford Memorial Book Scholarship. Theresa Drakeford was a member of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated, Omicron Phi Zeta Chapter, where she dedicated her life to scholarship and service. She was an alumna of Johnson C. Smith University and worked for the federal government for many years. This Scholarship will be awarded to a female student graduating from a District of Columbia high school and enrolling in an Historically Black College or University (HBCU) in the Fall of 2024. Scholarship awardees will be notified by March 15, 2024, of their selection to receive a scholarship. The award recipient or representative of the awardee must be available March 24, 2024 to attend the reception to accept the award.

THE SCHOLARSHIP

This book scholarship will be awarded in the amount of \$1000.00 to one (1) student graduating from high school. The student must also be enrolled at a HBCU the Fall 2024 academic semester. Proof of attendance must be on the university/college letterhead and must be received by email or post-marked by mail by September 20th to receive the disbursement.



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ELIGIBILITY

Each applicant must:

- Be a female resident of the District of Columbia;
- Be graduating from an accredited high school in the Washington, DC at the end of the 2023-2024 academic school year;
- Attending a Historically Black College or University (HBCU) in the Fall of 2024; and
- Have a Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.75 or above at the time of application submission.

REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must submit the following items:

- 1. Completed typed, written (legible print) or computer-generated application form.
- 2. A 500-word essay addressing one of the following topics:
 - a) If given the opportunity, how would you make the world a better place?
 - b) What does it mean to be a Community Conscious, Action Oriented person?
 - c) Who is your biggest influence and why?
- 3. A current, official (sealed) copy of your high school transcript. An electronic unofficial transcript is also acceptable.
- 4. Resume
- 5. Two (2) letters of recommendation. Recommendations can be obtained from a current or former teacher, guidance counselor, principal, pastor, employer, coach, or extracurricular activities director.
- 6. Application Package Completion Checklist

- The Application package is due on **February 9**, **2024 at 11:59 pm**.
