Omicron Phi Zeta Chapter and Women of the Dove Foundation Dr. Juanita J. Davis Educational Scholarship

On January 16, 1920, Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated was founded on the campus of Howard University by five visionary women who dared to depart from the traditional coalitions for black women and sought to establish a new organization based on the precepts of Scholarship, Service, Sisterhood and Finer Womanhood.

In furtherance of the vision of the founders, Omicron Phi Zeta Chapter was chartered on March 26, 1994. Since its chartering almost 32 years ago, Omicron Phi Zeta chapter members have supported a variety of causes and organizations, in addition to the Sorority's national initiatives. Omicron Phi Zeta is an award-winning chapter for its commitment to Z-HOPE (Zetas Helping Other People Excel) projects, involvement with its youth auxiliary and Undergraduate Chapter, Xi Sigma at The George Washington University.

The Women of the Dove Foundation (WDF) is the 501(c)3 organization that partners with Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated, Omicron Phi Zeta Chapter. WDF is dedicated to improving the quality of life for individuals and families in local, national, and global communities. Every year, the foundation sponsors events to raise funds for WDF scholarships and other charitable causes.

We are pleased to announce the **2025 Dr. Juanita J. Davis Educational Scholarship**. Dr. Davis is a member of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated, Omicron Phi Zeta Chapter, where she dedicates her life to scholarship and service. She is an alumna of Claflin University and has served as an educator across all levels. This Scholarship will be awarded to a female student graduating from a high school in the Metropolitan area (see *Eligibility Criteria* for DC area breakdown) and enrolling in an Historically Black College or University (HBCU) in the Fall of 2026. Scholarship awardees will be notified by May 1, 2026, of their selection to receive a scholarship. The award recipient or representative of the awardee must be available June 7, 2026, to attend the reception to accept the award. This scholarship will be awarded annually to a one-time recipient.

THE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship will be awarded in the amount of \$1000.00 to one (1) student graduating from high school. The student must also be enrolled at an HBCU in the Fall 2026 academic semester. Proof of attendance must be on the university/college letterhead, with your student identification number and the address to the financial aid department, must be received by email or postmarked by mail by August 22, 2026, to receive the disbursement.



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ELIGIBILITY

Each applicant must:

- Be a female resident of the DC Metropolitan area (to include Washington, D.C.; Alexandria, VA; Arlington County, VA; Fairfax County, VA; Falls Church, VA; Prince William County, VA and Prince Georges County, MD; Montgomery County, MD; or Charles County, MD);
- Graduating from an accredited high school in the Metropolitan area at the end of the 2025-2026 academic school year;
- Be attending a Historically Black College or University (HBCU) in the Fall of 2026;
- Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.75 or above at the time of application submission; and
- Must be majoring in health/medical or educational field.

REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must submit the following items:

- 1. Completed typed, written (legible print) or computer-generated application form.
- 2. A 250-word essay addressing one of the following topics:
 - a) With the world facing a myriad of challenges, how would you make the world a better place?
 - b) What are your strengths and how would you use them to make a change in your community?
 - c) Who are your role models and how have they impacted your life goals?
- 3. A current, official (sealed) copy of your high school transcript. An electronic unofficial transcript is also acceptable.
- 4. A 150-200-word bio.
- 5. Two (2) letters of recommendation. Recommendations can be obtained from a current or former teacher, guidance counselor, principal, pastor, employer, coach, or extracurricular activities director. *Please note that ALL recommendations must be received by the due date for your application package to be reviewed.*
- 6. Application Package Completion Checklist.

- The Application package is due on **April 5**, **2026**, **at 11:59 pm**.
