





"Involuntary Solitude is a visual metaphoric representation of my personal journey during the 2020 lockdown. It represents the many layers of emotions, fragility, and vulnerability. Solitude is a state where the mind, far from constant stimuli, becomes self-aware. With this Installation Art I also wanted to give a tribute to my favorites Gustav Klimt, Vincent Van Gogh, and Gabriel Garcia Marquez. They all gave me many emotions on my early twenties, and still do. When Klimt died, an unfinished painting entitled The Bride was left in his studio. Vincent's Van Gogh's Bedroom at Arles two chairs pointing towards his bed it's said can be signs of his self-awareness. And I used yellow because is a color full of symbolisms in Gabriel Garcia Marquez's 'One Hundred Years of Solitude', a book I have read again and again at different stages of my life."
