Dragon Lands on Renton Rooftop! Renton's Challenge to the Fremont Troll

On Saturday, April 13, Renton celebrated the installation of the city's latest public art piece in the historic downtown as crowds gathered to witness the "lighting of the dragon." The dragon project was a collaboration between Marsha Rollinger and Dylan Neuwirth, the Creative Director at Western Neon, and the whole Western Neon team.

Renton is a culturally diverse city, and dragons appear in many different cultures. Wizards of the Coast (Dungeons & Dragons, Magic the Gathering, etc.) is also headquartered here in Renton, which is another tie-in, along with Boeing's Renton plant and the Renton Airport being located so close to downtown (ties to the flight aspect).

The city council approved this project with funding from the 1% for the Arts to make it a reality. This 750-pound beauty sits atop the corner building at South 3rd Street and Wells Avenue South, standing nearly 15 feet above the parapet.

It's hard to miss the silver head and glowing eyes peering down as you walk or drive by.









Installation of the 750-pound dragon atop the downtown building was a challenging task, but city crews were up to the chore.

The dragon is a permanent installation and has the potential to be to Renton, what the *Troll Under the Bridge* is to Fremont.



Annual Chalk Art Contest

Remember when the first time you wrote on the sidewalk with chalk? Perhaps a hopscotch grid or maybe your name? Come down to Liberty Park and experience the joy of creating art in a public and collective way. Grab a bucket of chalk and relive your childhood!

During Renton River Days, participants of all skill levels are invited to create chalk drawings on the tennis courts in Liberty Park. Professional and amateur artists, work side by side to transformation plain old green pavement into gorgeous, vibrant scenes of science fantasy, mystery, and depictions of everyday life.

Visitors to Renton's two-day summer festival can expect to see a wide variety of talent from stick figures to drawings that bring the tennis court to life.

Part of the allure of these public art works, made of chalk and pavement, is that they are created to be disappear. The magic comes when the public gets to witness the artistic process, something that is usually tucked away in a studio, emerging out there on the tennis courts.

Dragons, giant colorful koi, science fiction creatures, and yellow rubber duckies, slowly begin to appear, only to be washed away days later. How, one might wonder, can artists work for hours creating art, knowing it's only temporary?





Artists, who want to be considered for cash prizes and awards, will be divided into five categories: Professional Artist; Adults, ages 18 and up; Juniors, ages 13-17; and Tweens ages 9-12. (The children's division is not judged, but all participating young artists receive a prize). Judging begins at 3:00 p.m. Awards will be given in each division and the People's Choice and Best Theme will be presented 3:30 p.m. This year, Chalk Art will take place on **Saturday**, **July 27**, **2019**, immediately following the Renton River Days Parade. Each artist will receive a selection of colorful chalk and an assigned square and registration is free!

Come on down and witness, first hand, the magical transformation of plain green pavement into intricate arrangements of unexpectedly bold and vibrant beauty.

Public Art Opportunity! Paint a Fire Hydrant

The Arts Commission has partnered with the South Renton Neighborhood Association to participate in an exciting new public art campaign. Sybil McInttyre is one of several local artists who answered the call from the Arts Commission and South Renton Neighborhood Association, to submit designs for their fire hydrant project. Artists will transform twenty hydrants in the South Renton neighborhood into works of art in downtown Renton.

The goal of this program is to embrace the artistic talents of local individuals while displaying creative artwork throughout the community. The hydrant project gives the public a chance to see that art can be created anywhere and from anything.



Interested artists will be permitted to "adopt" fire hydrants within the South Renton neighborhood and create artistic designs for them. There is no specific theme for this program, though artists are encouraged to incorporate the character and history of the surrounding environment and neighborhood into their artwork. The program is free and open to the public. Selected artists will receive \$300 per hydrant to cover the cost of materials, supplies and design fees.

It was my pleasure to visit with Allied Arts of Renton's earliest member, Bea Mathewson. Bea started was born in Beaux Arts Village on May 4 and will turn 104 years young on that date this year! We met in the office of her home at Merrill Gardens in Renton. She just moved there a year ago. Before that, she was still managing alone in the family home that she had moved to with her husband in 1939. The family home and property was near the present day Fred Meyers and they were involved in the coal mining industry and automotive services.

Bea has been supporting Allied Arts of Renton since the 1960's. She was a founding member of the Philanthropic Education Association. Their goal is to promote education for women. She has always reached out to help people in the community. She told me, "It's the way things were back then. If someone needs something done, you just do it. It's part of the flow of life."

As a member and past president of the local chapter of the International Business and Professional Women group, she participated in many civic ventures to open opportunities for women. She has travelled extensively, worked for many years in the school district, is still involved in a book club, and is active in the First United Methodist Church. Also has always been a strong presence in Renton and was one of the earliest benefactors for Renton River Days. Bea is close to her children and grandchildren. Two sons were in the service during the Vietnam War.

I was impressed that she is not intimidated by the electronic age as so many younger people are. I know she communicates by email with many family members and friends. I asked her if she used her computer often, and she said, "Yes, but I like my IPad better." What an amazing woman!
