



Pastor's Notes

One of the beloved scripture passages of Christmas is Matthew 1:23b



"...they shall call his name Immanuel" [which means, God with us]." [ESV]

In many ways, that concept, more than any other, summarizes what transpired when Jesus was born and walked the earth. God was literally and physically here on earth with us in a way unique to all history. Not only that, but among the last words Jesus uttered before ascending to heaven after the resurrection is a similar promise:

"And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28:20b [ESV]

What does it mean to you that Christ is with you? That is a concept I want to use as our focus for this Advent season leading up to Christmas. In fact, I want to focus on it in a distinct way. Nobody says "behold" anymore. If we were trying to express what that says, we would more likely begin our sentence with something like, "Look here," or "See," or "Pay attention." Well, that is what I am inviting us to do in with the notion that God is with us as we enter the Christmas season.

If God is with us, I want to suggest this Advent that we journey toward Christmas and really focus on the Immanuel concept, that we seek to identify his presence in our daily world, to look and see what he is doing, saying, and seek to hone our ability to recognize the move of his Spirit around us. This year, Nola and I want to give you our Christmas present early as part of this special focus. We purchased little crosses carved from olive wood near Bethlehem in Israel. I want you to carry that cross wherever you go. Keep it in your pocket or in your purse, and whenever you stop to sit somewhere, pull it out and set it out visibly beside you, on the kitchen counter, the end table, the dinner table, the nightstand. Let it remind you in each of the places you go, in every activity you undertake, and in every experience, you have, God is with you, and then take the time to look around and try to identify how God is present in that environment.

Then whenever you have one of those moments that you are especially aware of God's presence, jot a note of reminder (I have little notebooks for those who would want to use one]. Record these God

sightings in your life. Christmas Eve, I am going to invite you to bring those notes with you, for they will be core to our Christmas Eve service. Watch and see, what God is doing in your life this Advent. Let me close by providing a few other scriptures that speak of God's presence:

"That they should seek God, and perhaps feel their way toward him and find him. Yet he is actually not far from each one of us,, for In him we live and move and have our being' Acts 17:27-28 [ESV]

"Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you?"

Where is the reference and who was the individual? Mark 14:50-52, and the individual is unnamed, but because Mark was known to be younger at the time, and because he was known to have associated with Peter, and since this is the only Gospel that records the event. Even though Matthew and Luke clearly had copies of Mark's Gospel when they wrote theirs, it is believed that he is referring to himself, anonymously, in a story only he knew.

MINI MISSION CONFERENCE



"...you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." Acts 1:8







After our mission conference, some people were inquiring about the process we have to support our missionaries financially. We thought it would be helpful to provide guidance in that area. Giving to the World Mission Offering helps the overall work of our International Ministries, and offerings to America for Christ helps the overall work of missionaries and camps within the United States. However, the International Missionaries have to raise committed financial support to back their own ministry, with IM providing the other supports required for the work to succeed. So to help any of the missionaries we have come, it is good to provide support for them individually.

This is done multiple ways:

- 1. There have been times in recent years that our leadership divided the World Mission Offering receipts between the general fund and the individual missionaries that have come to our church or are our special interest missionaries.
- 2. At any time you are free to give in the regular offering envelope a gift you want to specify for a specific missionary and it will go through the church accounts and to that missionary's support.
- 3. You can give directly to International Ministries either as a one-time gift or a recurring monthly gift that is charged to your credit card or debited from your bank account.



Mike called the meeting to order with prayer.

Pastor read a devotion regarding thermostats which encouraged us to be like one with a vision looking forward to 2022 and what will be...

June reported the youth and children's activities began on October 13. The Fun Night with BBQ and animals was October 27. On November 3, the youth had sixteen and Kids Club had twelve. The van picked up those who needed rides. Food is being brought in for the youth to eat. A Family Christmas Festival is being planned for December 8. Following a soup and sandwich dinner, there will be stations with games and activities for the whole families. This will be the last youth/children's activity for this year.

Mary Lamberty reported a Mini Mission weekend with Eric and Yuree Lembke and Larry and Becky Stanton, Global Missionaries. Homeless Ministry with Steve Neal of Kansas City and Luke Chavanne with our local mission.

A Harvest Dinner is planned for this Sunday morning.

Randy reported a negative balance of \$1,739.44 in the checking account for October. There were three payrolls this month. After discussion, June made a motion to withdraw \$15,000 from the General Endowment to meet general operating expenses for the remainder of the year. It was seconded by Eileen. Motion approved by vote.

Don reported the mulch price of \$6150 has been approved for purchase. Some of the funds have been donated and it was approved to take the remaining balance out of the Youth Endowment.

Projects in the works are roof leaks on the parsonage and the church, sanctuary lighting, removal of the old piano behind the sanctuary and the switch from Spectrum to Allo to a faster service at the same cost. The final security camera has yet to be installed. Contracts for next year with "Pave the Way" to complete the paving on the north side of the building and with General Restoration to replace the basement windows have been signed. Art Sorenson has contacted Don about using his mother's (Evelyn Sorenson Houston) memorial Fund to repair the organ.
