

But Zion said, "The LORD has forsaken me; my Lord has forgotten me." "Can a woman forget her nursing child, that she should have no compassion on the son of her womb?"



Even these may forget, yet I will not forget you. Behold, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands; your walls are continually before me. –Isaiah 49:14-16

It is hard to believe that we are quickly coming to the point that it has been almost a year since the pandemic started and our worship services first closed down. Now, after all these months, there are still many of you who have not yet attended worship again, choosing a more cautious path for personal health reasons during this pandemic. Perhaps, as you have spent so much time at home, maybe even suffering a bad case of "cabin fever", you have had days when you have felt forgotten.

Throughout the year last year, the leadership serving on the Vision Team sought to find tangible ways to make sure that each of you knows that you are not forgotten by your church. More than once we have heard how much it meant to be remembered. I would like to join the many of you who have expressed appreciation for those who have done so much to let our congregation know they are not forgotten, even during a time of isolation.

More importantly, it is important to be reminded that even if nobody else notices, God never forgets you. This month's passage makes clear how important we are to Him. We are engraved on the palms of His hands. He is more mindful of us than a new mother is of her baby. We are never out of His sight. God is never more than a breath away. God will not, does not, indeed cannot forget YOU!


Now God can forget because he chooses to forget in certain instances. This passage in Jeremiah (quoted also in Hebrews) tells us exactly what it is God forgets:

And no longer shall each one teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying, 'Know the LORD,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the LORD. For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more."

--Jeremiah 31:34







I think God forgets our sins better than we do, because all too often we carry around a load of quilt and regret over past sins and mistakes. But do you realize that once God has forgiven you, He doesn't remember them against you? Imagine going before God and praying, "God, I know you forgave me, but I still feel badly about that time I let you down, and hurt others, with my sin. Then God would reply, "I don't know what you are talking about. I don't remember you letting me down, you are hurting others, your sinning. I have forgotten them, and I refuse to remember them!"

I am grateful for God's forgetfulness, but I am just as grateful for his promise to NOT forget me, to NOT forget you. Could I offer you a little challenge for the month of February? Let's review one more scripture:

Now I commend you because you remember me in everything and maintain the traditions even as I delivered them to you. – 1 Corinthians 11:2

If you are one of the people who have felt isolated and been cheered by the little things the Vision Team and their helpers have done to make sure you know you are not forgotten, then could I make a suggestion to you? Paul was on the flip side of the situation, he asked the churches to remember HIM, their leader, their founder, their teacher! If you are isolating there at home, perhaps there are some others in the church or community who need to know that THEY are not forgotten as well. Not just the others who are isolated, but even the people who are out and about some, who attend worship and see one another. Those people miss seeing YOU and might be thrilled to know that YOU have not forgotten THEM This church member, though either! Find a way to let someone know you are thinking of them, even while you are living in isolation. Make that phone call, send that text, mail that letter, post a note on Facebook.... you know how important it feels to not be forgotten; give someone else that same feeling. Use the card provided with this delivery to mail to one of those people.

Saint Valentine: Who Was He?

Saint Valentine was a priest near Rome in about the year 270 A.D. At that time the Roman Emperor was imprisoning Christians for not worshiping the Roman gods.

During this persecution Valentine was arrested. Some write that he was arrested because he was performing Christian marriages, but others say it was for helping Christians escape prison.



During the trial they asked Valentine what he thought of the Roman gods Jupiter and Mercury. Valentine said they were false gods and that the God whom Jesus called father was the only true God. So the Romans threw him in prison for insulting the aods.

While in prison, Valentine continued to minister. He witnessed to the guards. One of the guards was a good man who had adopted a blind girl. He asked Valentine if his God could help his daughter. Valentine prayed and the girl was given her sight. The guard and his whole family, 46 people, believed in Jesus and were baptized. Because these people had come to know Jesus, Valentine praised God right there in his prison cell. When the emperor heard about this, he was furious that Valentine was still making converts even in prison, so he had Valentine beheaded.

Valentine knew that he might get caught in his Christian activities. He knew that if he told the court the truth about the Roman gods that he would be thrown in prison, And he knew that if he continued to witness of Christ in the prison he would make his captors angry. But he continued, because he loved the Lord and his fellow humans. He was willing to risk his life to free the prisoners and spread the Good News of Jesus Christ to those who needed to hear it.



Following a combined Worship at 10:00, a congregational meeting was called by Pastor Crooks.

Mike Raasch opened the meeting with his usual humor. The Vision format trial was first to be discussed. A motion was made by Shelly Bowen to continue using the format. Second was made by Marcia Hill. A voice vote was unanimous to approve for 2021.

Page 4 in the Annual Report Lists the roster of elected offices. Mary Weldon made a motion to accept the roster. It was seconded by Mary Lamberty. Motion carried.

A question about the Staff Relations Committee was asked. Mike reported the Personnel team replaced the Staff Relations Committee and the Personnel Team members are Shelly Bowen, Joel Foreman, Marcia Hill, Mike Raasch, and Mary Weldon.
