

### May 2021 Pastor's Notes

Mark 6:31 (RSV)







And he said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a lonely place, and rest a while." For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat. -Mark 1:35

And in the morning, a great while before day, he rose and went out to a lonely place, and there he prayed. --

Shortly before writing this article, several men and myself spent Saturday afternoon out at Moses Merrill working on clearing trails from fallen trees. In preparation for that, we purchased a chain saw to be able to give them, trusting that donations would cover the costs. At the end of last year, our church raised money to remodel one of the cabins at the camp. I have been out to camp speaking at Vespers Services for the mission focused camp for young campers. In case you haven't figured it out yet, I am strongly in favor of our camping program and Moses Merrill. Not only that, but I am privileged to pastor this church, which is filled with people and a history supportive of the camp as well. I have not always had churches as closely connected to our camps as this church is, and it thrills my heart that our church has this relationship.

Each year, our church sends young people to camp, scholar shipping half or sometimes all of the camping cost for them. We are, once again, on the verge of camp season, and I look forward to hearing stories of our young people's experiences there. We have had young adults from our church work at camp in various roles as well. Why am I so strong on camping?

Well, if you knew MY story, you might find it a bit strange that I am so sold on camping, since during my own childhood, I rarely went to camp because some of my camping experiences were less than great. And yet, I have had multiple opportunities to be involved in camp leadership as an adult, and have personally witnessed the marvelous things God does in the lives of campers and camp staff year after year. In fact, studies show that church camp is one of the most effective ministries our churches do in this day and age. Many of our young people come to Christ through camping ministry year after year. Have you ever wondered why?

In Jesus's life, he found spiritual refreshment in the presence of God out away from the hustle and bustle of life, out in the lonely wilderness places, including the reference above in Mark. Also in Mark, Jesus encouraged his disciples to develop the same habit, calling them aside time after time. There is something special about being away from our daily lives out



where distractions are minimized and we are immersed in the handiwork of God's creative hand. When that is combined with special focus on God's Word, the experience is unique for our spiritual growth. Moses was shaped in the wilderness. Elijah met God in the wilderness. David spent time in the wilderness, where he apparently wrote several of the Psalms. John the Baptist built his ministry around wilderness experiences. Paul experienced God teaching him out in the wilderness after he first came to Christ.

In this day and age, with all the technology and social media connections, with all the many, many activity opportunities bombarding our young people, making time out in the wilderness to focus on God is becoming rarer and rarer, and as a result, more and more powerfully used of God. With such a beautiful camp as Moses Merrill, and such enthusiastic and biblical leadership, our region is truly blessed with opportunities for our kids, as well as adults. I invite you to consider finding your own ways of supporting this great ministry of our region, whether by praying specifically for the camping program this year, or giving to camp projects as we have been doing, or donating money to help pay for camp costs for some of our kids, or inviting and sponsoring a neighbor or family youth to go. God has truly blessed us with this great facility, and people in our church have personal connections going back to the beginning of Moses Merrill Camp. Just thought I'd put in a good word for



### VISION TEAM MONTHLY REPORT: APRIL 10, 2021

Members present: Pastor Richard, Joel Foreman, Mary Weldon, Shelly Bowen, June Cardwell, Mike Raasch, Eileen Cash, Marcia Hill, Randy Cash, Don Charleston, and Dorothy Charleston.



Pastor Richard opened the meeting with prayer.

Randy reviewed the Balance sheet for March. The bank balance in the checking account was \$16,576.55 at the end of March. The Memorial Fund had \$38,931.10 and Endowment was \$346,709.25. America for Christ balance was \$7,902. It nearly doubled the goal. The parking lot repair fund has reached \$3400, \$10,000 has been pledged. Elevator payment and Utilities were \$3700. March had \$1400 more income than expenses.

Don reported the Endowment has had excessive withdrawal and \$93,000 needs to be paid back. He reported the roof leaks have been repaired and asked if any more ceiling tiles were stored somewhere. He moved that the cost of the handrail in the front of the sanctuary(\$850) be paid from Memorial Funds. Motion was seconded and the vote approved.

The calendar was discussed. The plan for JC Fremont Days hasn't been finalized so future plans will be discussed at a later date. Joel reported the Men made \$65.00 from the Pancake Breakfast. Nola and some friends got together for an Easter Dinner at the church and included some members who would of otherwise spent Easter alone. Pastor suggested that this might be a need worth making an annual project, and suggested we consider that possibility.

Shelly suggested we begin the 5th Sunday Movie nights again. The first date would be May 30.

August 14 has been reserved for Life line Screening at the Family Center.

June reported the last night for Kids Club will be May 5 with a BBQ . Caleb had 13 kids this week at Youth Group. Rachel Adams is the only senior graduating. Scholarships were discussed. They welcome volunteers for VBS at MMCCC on June 11.

Personnel Team reported David Manzer will be given a leave until Mother's Day. He will work 8 hours per week until then. Amity will substitute part time. They are considering options in terms of replacing Kristi's work with the youth, and will be bringing recommendations at a later date.

The ice storm last fall has left an overwhelming amount of damage. A Clean up day was organized. With the help of the electric chainsaw donated by FBC tree branches were cut and trails were cleared of sticks.

Pastor indicated that now things are opening up a bit and we are able to do some of the ministries we have done in the past, then we need to begin building and clarifying the way the new structure works. As part of it, the Vision Team was given a copy of sample report and a planning guide for the various Mission Impact Projects, that used the Tables for Two to illustrate how we go about building the guidebook and reporting, and asked Vision Team members to use the model to prepare similar reports for activities that groups in their areas have been doing in the past year, and explain that those doing the projects, are the best able to prepare these materials. The process can help individuals find their "niche" in the ministries of the church and a sense of how God wants to use them.

In addition, he suggested it is time to consider the questions of what as church leaders learned about our church and God's work in us through the experiences of the last year and how it will shape what we do going forward. Pastor also suggested we might consider, for example, a focus of developing a strong senior citizen ministry, because we have seen how hard this past year has been for seniors who have been isolated. Pastor also passed around copies of the current Building Use Guidelines that are in need of being updated for our review, and indicated we will be considering revisions in the near future

Hymnals have been returned to pew racks.

The Biennial will be online the end of June, a change from Puerto Rico.

Mike shared a report of Memorial Funds income and disbursements prepared by Lynda.

Pastor also reported Dick and Bev Holmen will be moving to St. Louis near their son on April 24. He suggested a card shower as they are unable to attend here. Cards are available at the office if you would like one. They will be mailed in a packet to their new address.



The meeting was closed and ended with prayer by Mike.


