Pastor and Nola are on vacation, and Pastor has given me permission to write a note. With Easter behind us, I just wanted to share some thoughts on how important it is to continue to walk with God, or try and figure out how and where to start? For me, I start by thinking how I would walk with someone here in the physical world. To fully understand what it means to walk with God on a spiritual level, I first consider what it means to literally take a walk with a friend, my kids or relative. I ask myself how I interact with that person. What do I expect from that individual, and how do they speak and behave in return? Have you noticed when you take a walk with someone, the two of you are usually traveling in one direction. Your steps move at a similar pace so that neither one of you leaves the other behind. You talk with each other, and your attention remains on one another. In short, there is an overall sense of harmony, unity, and community between the two of you during your walk. Your in sync. This is what God wants with us.

We can all relate to the daily "Hustle and Bustle", and all the things that get in the way of walking with our Savior, one of the most important things for me, is to let go of distractions. Before we can truly focus on God, we need to let go of all the worldly things that distract us from our relationship with Him. These distractions may not be "sins," but they can include anything that you intentionally or subconsciously prioritize over God. Think again about what it is like to walk with a friend. If your friend spent the entire time on his or her cell phone rather than interacting with you, the walk would not be very enjoyable, and you would not actually be walking "together" on a meaningful level. Likewise, the distractions you focus on instead of focusing on God will prevent you from really walking together with Him.

How easy is it to take on our own burdens instead of praying about it. Prayer allows us to stay in a close and personal relationship. Prayers of thanksgiving, praise, and adoration all have their rightful place. The important thing is to pray what's in your heart and in your mind. Pray about EVERYTHING! He wants to hear from you.

How often has God sent you a sign, that you missed? Only to realize it later down the road. Let the Holy Spirit guide you. If you start to think that God is distant or silent, be patient. He is at work. God has a funny way of interrupting the usual flow of things, to lead you down the path you're meant to be on. These signs may be subtle, so be sure to keep your eyes and heart open to see them.

I also find it helpful to walk with others on the same spiritual path. Sure, you can certainly have friends and family outside of your own faith, however; it is important to fellowship with others who share your dedication to God. These people can become your support here on Earth, and you can support them in return. Other believers can also help keep you accountable to the commitment you have made to walk with God.

What I find most helpful is to just KEEP WALKING. No matter how many times you trip stumble, or fall all you need to do is dust yourself off and continue to walk. God will not turn you away, even if you temporarily lose sight of the road, He is there.

Lastly, have patience (This one the hardest for me), The answer to a prayer or the solution to a difficult circumstance doesn't always arrive the way we want it too. There's going to be times when you must slow down and walk at God's pace. Let Him guide you to where you are needed. Have Faith in His strides, some of God's greatest blessing come from unanswered prayers.



Randy Reported the bank balance of \$620. \$5700 was received from the Laten fund. More will be needed. America for Christ has received \$1145. Communion Fund received \$635. The bill for the playground was \$6150. \$2030 was donated. \$4120 will be drawn from the Youth Endowment as was approved in November minutes. A good Easter offering will be beneficial.

John reported the Property Committee has discussed the removal of the trees on the South of the church. The Prayer Room ceiling will be patched and painted. The Parsonage roof will be started next month. The repair of seals under the church doors, NOT just the Family Center, will be completed. The concrete and glass block on the North side will start this month.

Eileen reported Esther Circle donated \$200 for lap robes, On Tuesday Mary will give the Devotions and Mike Raasch will lead Bingo at the Senior Social Luncheon. The ABW meeting will include a Memorial for the ladies who have passed away this year.

June reviewed the lesson on March 30, she described Nola's and Shelly's teaching. She said Luke always reviews last week's lessons with the kids and they ask questions.


Joel reported Easter breakfast plans are underway.


