# May 2024



## Open my eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of your law. --Psalm 119:18



Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth. --2 Timothy 2:15

We just completed sharing together our Lenten Devotional that some of you helped create, and our various study groups are winding down or have completed the last cycle of Bible study topics we have worked on together. In this moment, I would like to share with you something that I find more enjoyable, meaningful and precious than a lot of the things I spend time with as a pastor. In other years, we have had so many concerns that, as a church, needed to be addressed, but in the past year or so, I feel like we have come to a time when we can focus on these things that are dear to my heart.

In these past months, I have heard many comment about the things they learned or appreciated in both of those types of experiences. Of all the things I long for as a pastor, one I especially value is helping my congregation (and others) come to a fresh and deeper understanding of God's Word. It is all too easy to slip into a rut with our time in the Bible, or to become so familiar with some passages that when we encounter them, we just skim over them quickly and miss the richness that is there. In the last Thursday afternoon study we had, including some individuals online, I truly enjoyed reviewing a very familiar passage in a fresh way, sharing things together that we had not seen before, with fresh application. And the amazing thing is, we could go over that same passage again, and discover even more! It is just amazing how much richness is embedded in the pages of our Bibles, for those willing to take the time to search while listening for the Spirit of God.

I love the image of the Psalmist's prayer above: "Open my eyes! Show me the wondrous things in the Word!" Is that YOUR prayer? Down through the years, I have had the privilege of studying the Bible under some wonderfully godly individuals, and in my own personal efforts... and still, after all these years, I continue to be stunned by things I discover, and things I have yet to understand and search out. What I long for is not merely that my congregations know the Bible well, but that

you experience the wonders of it, that you hear God speak to you in it, and learn how to apply more and more of its teachings in our lives. It is just incredible the things God has hidden in the pages of scripture to be discovered by those who search its pages diligently. Words of guidance, words of the secrets of the universe, words of assurance and comfort, words of hope, words that open our eyes, hearts and minds to know well the God we serve. It is my hope that we will always long for and pursue to experience God's word on a deeper level for more and more of the wondrous things hidden there.

The Timothy passage reminds us that these things don't come to us automatically. They take effort on our part...the King James says "study to show yourself approved." Reading God's Word, hearing it, spending time reflecting on it, memorizing it, discussing it, learning from others their insights and sharing our own...in all the ups and downs of life, these are the words God will use to get us through. I especially believe that small groups studying the Bible together and sharing their spiritual lives with one another is one of the most vital and powerful activities Christians can pursue.

In coming months, we will begin another study series on some of the parables...both on some Sunday mornings and in study groups. I invite you now to begin reading and studying some of them on your own in preparation for that time, and if there is one in particular you would like us to include, drop me a note and we will do so. At the same time, I want to invite you to consider entering more fully into one of these disciplines. Perhaps it will be to read (OR LISTEN!) through the entire Bible or New Testament. Perhaps you might choose to memorize some favorite passages, or do a personal in-depth study of one on your own. We have been having all sorts of times and topics for Bible studies in the church: weekly on Wednesday evenings, and recently on most Sunday mornings at 11:00 and Fridays at noon, once a month on Saturdays there is a Men's Study and also a Women's Study, every other Thursday afternoon we have a group study that includes some people online. I also lead a study once a month out at Nye Square. Some of these groups will be taking a break and then looking to start up again in a few weeks. However, maybe these are not what you want to pursue, perhaps instead you would offer yourself or your home to God to start a new group in some other time slot.



Friends, how I wish you could see all the wondrous things I have seen in the Bible (and that I could see all those that YOU have!)

P.S. We all enjoyed reading all the different perspectives during Lent. I want to invite EVERYONE to write one or two that we could use for the coming

Thanksgiving and Christmas season. You have lots of time, and I would be glad to help you get your thoughts down on paper if that would help. What wondrous thing that God has shown YOU, might you be willing to share for a booklet this fall?



#### **April 13, 2024 Vision Minutes:**

In attendance were Mike Raasch, Joel Foreman, Marcia Hill, Larry Hill, Randy Cash, Eileen Cash, Alan Holzerland, Mark Anderson, Vicki Anderson, Marilyn Pueppke, Betty Laughlin, Mary Weldon and Pastor Richard.



Marcia reported five kids are going to Estes Park, CO with adults June 5-10, 2024. They continue to fundraise. Rent-A-Kid is happening in April. Last week of Kid's Club is May 8, 2024 with a bounce house being supplied to use. Men will be providing the meal. The attendance for Club has been down since Easter which is normal. Craft day for girls 3rd grade and up is planned for April 20, 2024. Vacation Bible School will be hosted at camp with the date TBD. Having Bible School at camp was a good way to introduce the summer camps to children in attendance.

Approximately \$3,400.00 is in the camp scholarship funds at this time, and will be used as needed for summer campers.



Randy reported a current checking account balance of \$6,112.01. Bills due and upcoming projects were discussed. The Layton Trust installment was received with another expected end of June. The Building Fund is \$4,050.71, Memorials Fund is \$15,784.18, awaiting latest statement from AB Foundation and FSB is \$31,746.93.

Larry reported CR-Men returned on April 12, 2024 to look at expanded project needs with the current bid at \$9,640.00. We have one large office space in the Family Center now open for lease.

Pastor reported south system project/update is ongoing but may still need tweaking. Not completely sure what work has been completed but have seen improvement in some area when using the system. Pastor reported the online World Mission Conference is the evening of May 21 and the morning of May22, 2024 with Walt and Janine White participating here at our church. We are signed up as a church. They are here in person and other missionaries/churches will be joining online. Blair and Valley churches will be invited to attend. This and the visit by the Hwang's will serve as our own Mission Conference for the year, with some of the budgeted funds going to the missionaries we host. Our church was featured in the Hwang's' newsletter along with the camp.

The idea of a Family Day at the camp was discussed. Bev is excited to work with the church with a date TBD but looking at August. It will be decided if this should be done on Saturday or on Sunday with worship first followed by activities. Consideration will be given to make sure that members with health concerns regarding the heat and environmental factors are able to participate.

Mark Anderson asked about the status of food distribution to the schools. Testing snacks went to Washington and Linden schools last week.

#### May Peoples Puzzle:

This month's individual experienced one of the scariest moments any parent can face, but in the midst of it learned obedience to God, surrender, and emerged a life-saving hero! When their infant child sent into seizures, resulting in a rapid drive to the hospital some miles away, the child stopped breathing and the parent began mouth to mouth resuscitation. Praying for God to act, God's response was to offer the child up to God...three times that was the response. Even though the baby had been dedicated, in prayer the child was given to God one more time, and shortly after, the baby began to breathe as they headed on to the hospital. Things turned out fine, and an significant life lesson and miracle resulted!

#### **April Bible Puzzle:**

Following up on March's puzzle, how many queens are named in the New Testament? And bonus question, what other women of political rulers are mentioned by name? Only a few wives of rulers mentioned in the New Testament. The two NT queens were Berenice wife of King Agrippa (Acts 25:13ff), Candace Queen of Ethiopia (Acts 8:27). The other political ruler wives are: Herodias wife of Herod Antipas (Matt. 14:3-6)--who though called king, was actually titled Tetrarch not king, Drusilla wife of Felix (Acts 24:24) and Pilate's wife (Matt. 27:19) both of whom were Roman "procurators" or "governors."

Pastor stated that Mark was able to pick up hats and gloves at large discounts when Hy-Vee put their stock on clearance to restock our supply for giving winter items to schools with students in need. These donations are accepted year round to build up inventory. Buying these items on clearance or off season makes our donations go further. Mark asked how we fundraise for these items and was told that we simply make a request for specific donations to fund this project. Eileen asked for a half dozen gloves and hats for Alaska project for the women's group.

On Sunday May 19, 2024 Richard and Sasha will be gone. Suzanne Smith with The Bridge will speak at the services. Larry inquired about inviting a speaker from Life House to come on a Sunday, and we will look into it for the fall.

Pastor stated that there has not been any response from Midland students about the intern youth position. The ad about the position will be edited to be a summer internship and will be sent again to Midland and Sioux Falls. The job description and hours may need to be adjusted depending on candidates needs.

Marcia and Pastor brought a special request for Endowment funding of youth this year, to assist with Colorado conference registration, etc. and other anticipated youth activities. Possibility of drawing \$4,000.00 now and then using fundraiser money and scholarship money to pay the remainder, or even repay some if fundraisers bring in sufficient to do so.

Updating some computer equipment was discussed, including office computer, an office laptop and the pastor's laptop. It is going to be an exploratory process, and it was agreed that memorial funds could be used to cover these expenses. Motion to approve \$4,000.00 for youth programming (plus withdrawing the \$3,000.00 approved but not drawn earlier this year) made by Joel and seconded by Marcia. All in favor, none opposed.

Randy indicated that one of the additional Fixit bills that had come was the replacing of heat/ac in the two youth rooms where window had been replaced. The bill was paid out of general checking as the Fixit fund had been depleted, but has left the church running tight. The other heating equipment costs came from the endowment. Motion to transfer \$13,000.00 from endowment to cover heating/ac bill (paid from the General checking account in February) made by Mary and seconded by Eileen. All in favor, none opposed.
