Pastor's Notes:

They call this pastor appreciation month. In every church I have worked in, I have been blessed with individuals who assured me they prayed for me and my family daily, and also individuals I knew



to be great confidential intercessors, whom I could call upon any time I had a personal request for myself or a private request for another, and knew they would actually seek God's aid for the matter. I truly believe that I, or any pastor, cannot do well in ministry without the prayer support of the congregation. I recently ran across a good article by Charles Spurgeon on this topic, and thought it an appropriate moment to share it with you for this month's article--

"'Brethren, pray for us.' -- 1 Thessalonians 5:25

This one morning in the year we have reserved to refresh the reader's memory upon the subject of prayer for ministers, and we do most earnestly implore every Christian household to grant the fervent request of the text first uttered by an apostle and now repeated by us. Brethren, our work is solemnly momentous, involving well-being or woe to thousands; we treat with souls for God on eternal business, and our word is either a savor of life unto life, or of death unto death. A very heavy responsibility rests on us, and it will be no small mercy if at the last we be found clear of the blood of all men. As officers in Christ's army, we are the especial mark of the enmity of men and devils; they watch for our halting, and labor to take us by the heels. Our sacred calling involves us in temptations from which you are exempt, above all it too often draws us away from our personal enjoyment of truth in to a ministerial and official consideration of it. We meet with many knotty cases and are in a nonplus; we observe very sad backslidings and our hearts are wounded; we see millions perishing and our spirits sink. We wish to profit you by our preaching; we desire to be blessed to your children; we long to be useful both to saints and sinners; therefore, dear friends, intercede for us with God. Miserable men are we if we miss the aid of your prayers, but happy are we if we live in your supplications. You do not look to us but to our Master for spiritual blessings, and yet how many times has He given those blessings through His ministers; ask then, again and again, that we may be the earthen vessels into which the Lord may put the treasure of the gospel. We, the whole company of missionaries, ministers, city missionaries, and students, do in the name of Jesus beseech you

"Brethren, pray for us." July 7 Reading Morning and Evening, Charles Spurgeon. Grand Rapids: Zondervan Publishing House.

So as Paul, and Spurgeon highlight: "Brothers and sisters, pray for us!" But then, let


me share with you some of my prayers for you, as well. Many of you have had moments in your lives when we have prayed together, at the hospital, in your home, over the phone. Sometimes, when I walk through the church sanctuary, I pray for you as I imagine you sitting in your usual



space (one advantage to you not moving around all the time!). Other times I may be driving across town and pass your home, and pray for you as I drive by, or I have also driven by the homes of some who have passed away, and pray for the family that is left...which includes some of you. Sometimes I pray as I flip through the church directory for one reason or another. And during my morning readings, often an individual or another would come to mind for whom to be in prayer. When I drive to Omaha or any distance, that is always a good place to take a little time for prayer (with my eyes open, mind you....). Some of my prayers, as I know yours as well, are for our church as a whole. My primary prayers are for God to move in your lives, in our midst, in such a way that we are all drawn into a deeper relationship with Christ day by day, with fresh insights we had never known, with opportunities to share our faith and the boldness to do so, and that we will see the fruit of the seeds we have been sowing. I also pray that we each may so grow in our love for one another and our community that we truly become a great bastion of faith that is known throughout Fremont and beyond as a church that is a mighty blessing to our community, through the power of God.

Nothing significant ever happens without first having been brought to the throne of God by his people!





June Cardwell reported on behalf of Christian Education that the Carnival Kick Off for Youth and Kids Club went well. There were close to 150 people in attendance and we went though close to 200 hot dogs. There were approximately 29 kids signed up for Kids Club but did not include a lot of the older kids that took home sign up sheets. June recognized the fantastic job Nola did in putting everything together and thanked everyone that came out to help. Richard added there were about 25 people who helped while Luke took the opportunity to reach out to the Youth kids about the bible and to see what they would like to learn this year. It was wonderful to not only see the kids but their family come and join in.

Marica Hill shared that Washington school is having a carnival September 24th, 2022. Marcia offered possible help with donating gift cards or candy that may have been left over from the carnival. First State Bank, was sitting with a balance of \$16,422.99 while the FSB – Designated Gifts were \$19,675.16. \$1,800 given for One Great Hour of Sharing and due to the market the Endowment fund has declined by about \$77,000.00. Money is available from the special projects which can be used.

A motion was made by Mary Weldon to move \$10,000 from the Memorial funds to general funds to cover the cost of replacing the parsonage roof. Eileen Cash second the motion. Motion was approved.

Richard reported on behalf of Mary Lamberty the Mission Conference is October, $8^{t} \otimes 9^{th}$ 2022. A combined service will be held Sunday, 10/09/22, at 10:00am with a luncheon being served afterwards. Some of the speakers that will be present are from the AB Foundation, Bacone College, International Ministry, Home Missions and Greg Mamula. A prelude to the conference will be held September, 24th, 2022 where Walt and Jeanie White from International Ministry will attend. A caterer is still needed for the luncheon.

Eileen Cash, ABW, reported they had 25 ladies attend their last meeting. In attendance was missionary Carmella Jones from Hungary.

Pastor Richard reported the revision of the constitution was still being worked on. The questions of what to leave in, take out, or the possibility of restructuring the constitution on how the Vision Team is held and who might be a representative on the team is still being looked at. Next month we will discuss the nominating and budget committees. Bible studies continues. The question was posed on how to encourage people who are attending church on a regular basis to become members.


