Let's also take time to consider briefly the time frame and preservation of the NT writings. There are no known documents of any New Testament book (the oft quoted phrase "inerrant in the original autographs" is, in my opinion, a useless statement). However, we do have multiple copies from different areas, some complete, some fragmentary, some fragments going back to just a few decades after the books were written. Variations between any of the documents are minimal compared to the agreement of the texts, and none are of real theological significance. In addition, there were people living as the NT was produced, who had been alive when Jesus, Paul and the other events of Acts occurred. If what was recorded was in any way inaccurate, all that needed to happen was for those witnesses to come forward and say, "I was there...that isn't what happened." None did. So the documentation we have, and the living witness recorded by contemporaries undergird the New Testament, rather than undermine it.

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice." --Philippians 4:4

Every once in a while I run across verses that just cause me to think, "Really? Rejoice? Always? Really? Just how does that work?" This verse is one of them for me....how about you? I mean....

What about when I find myself all alone and in a dangerous situation? That's an always....rejoice!!

Well, then what about when I'm in a traffic jam and late for work? That's an always....rejoice!!

Oh, and even when that guy cuts me off on the highway, almost making me wreck? Or when someone treats me poorly, saying and doing hurtful things? *That's an always....rejoice!!*

Yeah, well, how about the month I don't have the money to pay my bills? That's an always....rejoice!!

What if I lose my job, or my bank account gets hacked? That's an always....rejoice!!

Okay, but then, suppose the medical tests come back and I have a really bad condition, even one that might be life threatening? That's an always....rejoice!!

Alright, well, then how about if my spouse leaves me? *That's an always....rejoice!!*

What if my children, or family all turn against me? *That's an always....rejoice!!*

I know some people who lost their homes in the Elkhorn tornado... *That's an always....rejoice!!*

Even all those people struggling with all the hurricane damage? That's an always....rejoice!!

So does it apply to the people in war-torn Ukraine? *That's an always....rejoice!!*

Well then, how about if I lose a loved one and am grieving? We aren't supposed to pretend like the loss doesn't matter and not grieve are we? NO! But...even then.... *That's an always....rejoice!!*

Even if their death was in a tragic accident, or a long and awful illness? That's an always....rejoice!!

Well, bottom line though, some days, I just get blue and discouraged... and the truth is, I just don't FEEL like rejoicing. Paul didn't say FEEL LIKE REJOICING...he said REJOICE, so even then...
That's an always...rejoice!!

If you are like me, then at this point, you might have two questions. First, HOW?





The answer is simple. All those categories about describe the circumstances of life, which are constantly changing. But the verse says that we are to rejoice IN THE LORD....who never changes regardless of our circumstances. We still rejoice because our salvation remains secure, because God's love for us is everlasting, because our forgiveness through Jesus's sacrifice on the cross endures, because God's mercy endures forever and because most of all, since God is for us who can stand against us?

Second question, WHY? The answer is because of what rejoicing in the Lord accomplishes. Consider this verse from Nehemiah: "...for the joy of the Lord strength." --Nehemiah 8:10b

So, my friends, go and rejoice!

Which Old Testament books are most frequently quoted in the New Testament?

October Bible Puzzle:

Why in the Old Testament is the word "Lord" sometimes printed capitalized and not in New? Sometimes the word "LORD" is capitalized because it represents God's name as revealed to Moses in Exodus 3:14---YHWH...considered sacred, ineffable and not to be used lightly, so LORD is substituted for the name. (You will find details for your Bible's use of LORD in the preface or footnotes.) It doesn't occur in the New Testament because the New Testament is in Greek, so the Hebrew YHWH is never used there, only the Greek word for Lord, *kyrios*, which also serves double duty for Lord referring to God, and lord referring to someone in authority over another.

In youth group (and in lots of other places these days) this question sometimes arises: How do we know we can trust the New Testament is true (or the Bible....but this article is focusing on the New Testament). How can we know it wasn't just something made up by the disciples? Or that what we have

today is not at all like the original writings? There are several ways to approach this topic, so let us consider briefly a few of them.

One way to consider whether documents are historically true is to examine contemporary documents that would refute what is written. There are only a few outside sources that refer to Jesus, and then only in passing. Given that there was later such hostility against the Christians, if there was evidence or documentation that any of the New Testament was untrue, that environment would have been a perfect time to present and preserve them. There are no such documents that are in any way reliable. Even a single faithful record that explained how Jesus or the disciples had faked the resurrection, or that the body of Jesus had been recovered would have been irrefutable evidence against the New Testament. There are none. On the contrary, what have been discovered are evidence of various truths contained in the New Testament that attest to their historical reliability. For many years, Luke's odd wording about a "first census" and Quirinius being governor at the time of Jesus's birth appeared to conflict with what historical records existed...until Roman records were found containing information that verified Luke's words. In a similar way, there was no record of Pilate having ever been governor in Judea...until the archaeologists ran across an engraved stone specifically mentioning him serving in that role. John's wording by the woman at Jacob's well referring to "this mountain" had to be written by someone who was actually there and could see that the mountain is near enough to the well to make the wording "this mountain" logical for someone standing there. Enough examples for now.

In terms of the notion that the disciples made up the stories or formed some sort of conspiracy, the key question might be, "To what end?" The gospel story did not lead to wealth, popularity or fame, but to poverty, persecution, and infamy. So, what is it they sought to gain from making it all up? In addition, not only did they not benefit, one after another they suffered execution because of what they proclaimed, when all it would have taken to save their lives was to admit it was all a lie. Perhaps one or two people might knowingly die for a lie, but certainly not so many of the disciples, especially a lie that provided no benefit. In fact, if you examine the NT, you find that if it is a conspiracy, it is a conspiracy to help people become kinder people, more loving people, to care about the lives of others. Not anything one tends to find among lying conspirators, is it?



In attendance were Joel Foreman, Larry Hill, Marcia Hill, Randy Cash, Eileen Cast, Mary Weldon, Betty Laughlin, Vicki Anderson and Pastor Richard. Pastor opened the meeting with a devotional and prayer.



Mary reported that this year's Harvest Dinner is set up with Mel's

Diner for Sunday, Nov 24 at a cost of \$11.30 a plate. It will be a combined service with a chicken dinner including mashed potatoes and green beans, and we will arrange pie and whipped cream for dessert. Pastor suggested the folks at the Second Service might be able to arrange for the salads and will check tomorrow. Pastor led a discussion about missionary contact for it as we have in the past, but doing it as a tour of one of the missions online. The Vision Team thought we could check into getting a recording of such a tour from one of our IM missionaries and then do a live contact with Kelli Foreman about Kodiak.



At the Region Gathering, Nola signed us to fill a hospitality slot at next summer's Biennial Mission Summit in Omaha. Computer/software update is moving along, and the office computer will soon be checked to clean drive and enhance speed, then at some point the computer in Randy's office will be updated.

Randy presented the treasurer's report, and that at the end of the month there was \$16,936 in the checking, some of which is the insurance payment on hail damage, and that our new property insurance costs are now up to \$21,000 for 2024-25 paid quarterly, and vehicles are \$1700. He also reported the bank needs us to provide clarity on which accounts the various new signatories are to be listed on. Going over them, the clarification is that Randy Cash and Lynda Raasch are to be on the church's savings account (**073) and Memorial Fund account (**725). The General Checking account (**232), Buildings account (**194) and Youth Checking (*814) are to have all the signatories listed...Randy Cash, Shirley Angermund, Larry Hill, Lynda Raasch, Alan Holzerland, Deb Peterson and Judi Staab.

In closing, the VT made clear for the record that Pastor Richard and Nola attended the Region Gathering as delegates on behalf of the church, a motion made by Marcia and 2nd by Randy, motion approved. Names were then suggested to be asked to serve on the Nominations and Budget Teams. Betty Laughlin closed the meeting with prayer.
