Catawba Island Historical Society (CIHS) and our Township Trustees collaborated to convert Union Chapel on

E. Porter Street to a Museum and Genealogy/ Heritage Resource Center in 2018. It has subsequently been honored with placement on the National Register of Historic Places. More than just a repository for yellowed pages and dogeared photographs, the 1888 structure is now a focal point for using local history to educate, inspire, and prepare visitors for tomorrow by recounting the lessons of yesterday. The Society also sponsors a cultural lecture series. Both are free to the public. Operating cost is principally underwritten by CIHS membership dues, gifts, grants, and sponsorships.

### NABAGON

Look closely at our Historical Society logo. Do you see the facial profile of a Native American? It is topped by a lone Cypress tree which symbolically represents his feathered headdress. This is an artist's rendering of the heroic Ottawa Indian, Nabagon. Legend has it that his image was once magically carved into a cliff wall by the "Great Spirit" on the north shore of Catawba Island.

The original sculpted face has been lost to time and Lake Erie storms, but Nabagon refused to surrender his vigil. As seen in the photograph, his face has reappeared on "Lookout Point" not far from its original location. Locals refer to him as "The Watcher", believing his warrior soul looks over and protects all who fall under the inviting spell of Catawba Island splendor.

We selected the Nabagon name to represent our most prestigious level of membership in the Catawba Island Historical Society.

### **CATAWBA HISTORIAN**
