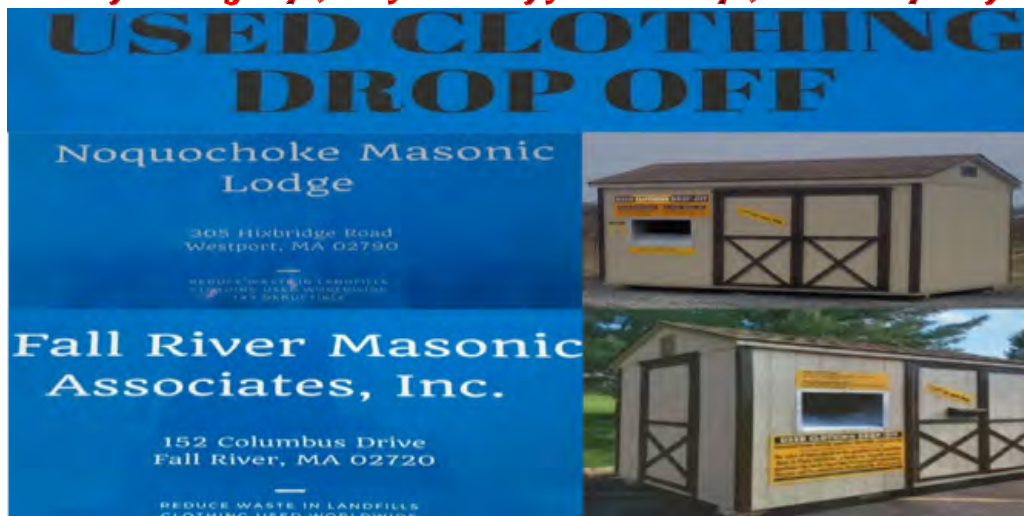

Freemasonry and Nazi Germany by Wor. Mark E. White



"In National socialistic Germany there is no place for Freemasonry" – Herman Goering
"Ourselves or the Freemasons or the Church – there is room for one of the three and no more, We are the strongest of the three and shall get rid of the other two." – Adolf Hitler

The Second World War began on September 1, 1939, with Germany invading Poland. From there Germany continued to annex the various European countries. Once a country was conquered, the German police forcibly closed down many Masonic lodges and branch headquarters of the Masons and confiscated their assets, including their libraries and archives. The Lodge was ransacked for membership lists, important library and archival items, furnishings, and other cultural artifacts. It is believed that the Jewish books and famous art collections were the most important things that were taken. Actually, it was the masonic archives that were the first cultural property that was taken. This was by order of Reich Leader Arthur Rosenberg (*Einsatzstab Reichsleiter*). In this way Germany would be permitted to carry on the "methodical intellectual fight" that was "necessary to win the war."

Free association between and among Masons under Nazi control was dangerous. However, there were Brothers who were determined not to give up their identity as Freemasons, even under these most difficult of circumstances. Along with Jews, homosexuals, those living with physical and mental handicaps, Catholics, and Jehovah's Witnesses – Freemasons were targeted for criminal prosecution and exclusion from society.

For Freemasons, the flower, the forget-me-not, is a symbol that reminded them of resilience and resistance, and of love for the Fraternity and its principles, even under distress and persecution. Thus, the blue forget-me-not, ostensibly a symbol of Nazi social policy, became a symbol of Freemasonry – a clandestine badge of membership. For Freemasons, the forget-me-not is a symbol that reminded them - and us now - of resilience and resistance, and of love for the Fraternity and its principles, even under distress and persecution.

Many of the Freemasons were arrested. Also included were Jews and/or members of the political opposition. Therefore, it is not known how many individuals were placed in Nazi concentration camps and/or were targeted only because they were Freemasons.

From 1941 to 1945 the Germans occupied the Channel Islands, the southern most part of the British Isles, namely Jersey and Guernsey. This is far as the Germans would get with their plans to occupy Britain. The SA troops from France were sent in preparation for the arrival of a professional squad called Wreckers. These were as many as 60 men as well as visits of officers from the higher staff, for destruction that was done on the Lodges of Jersey and Guernsey, an integral part of anti-masonic propaganda.

Three – three-ton lorries were used to remove artifacts such as chairs, pedestals, banner carpets, curtains etc., from the library and museum and shipped to Germany. At the end of the war all the archives taken by the Nazis were split up among the Americans, French, British and Soviets. The archives were returned to the respective countries by the Allied Forces except for the Russians. They secretly sent the archives to Moscow quite illegally. Since the end of the Cold War, many Masonic-related collections have been returned to their countries of origin, while others continue to be held in foreign repositories. The hope of recovering any missing, looted materials have faded.

Despite the darkness caused by the Nazi regime, a small light was shining. This was *Liberté chérie* (French for "Cherished Liberty"), a Masonic Lodge founded in 1943 by Belgian Resistance fighters and other political prisoners at Esterwagen concentration camp in Belgium. It was one of the few lodges of Freemasons founded within Nazi concentration camps during the Second World War. They conducted these meetings and ritual in secret from 1943-1944. During simple ceremonies. they asked the community of Catholic priests for assistance of maintaining secrecy, "with their prayers".

Along with Jews, homosexuals, those living with physical and mental handicaps, Catholics, and Jehovah's Witnesses – Freemasons were targeted for criminal prosecution and exclusion from society. It is estimated that 200,000 members lost their lives due to their membership in the Fraternity. We must remember never to forget. SO MOTE IT BE.
