MEET YOUR NEW MASTER

2025/2026

The District Newsletter team sat down with the newest Worshipful Masters and asked them six questions to get to know them. This is so you can feel more welcome to visit their lodges & know what they have planned for this masonic year.

Worshipful Adam Miranda Abraham H. Howland Jr. Lodge

My Masonic journey began in 2008 when I discovered that my grandfather was a Mason. One time I asked him about Freemasonry, and he told me that he had joined a Lodge in Leominster in 1944 when he returned home from his service in the Navy during WW2 and that it was a charitable organization. Other than this, he had never spoken of being a Mason to anyone. He was someone I always felt very connected to and highly respected. After his passing, I had the opportunity to purchase his home which I grew up down the street from. At this point, I discovered several more artifacts of his that were related to Masonry which piqued my curiosity. One day I went fishing with a friend who informed me that he was a Mason... I wasted absolutely no time asking him to help me get connected to the fraternity. Shortly thereafter, in 2012, I petitioned Abraham H. Howland, Jr. Lodge. When I first visited the Lodge, I met people that reminded me exactly of my grandfather and I knew I was in the right place.

2012 was a productive year for me! I turned 30, got married to Mary Jane who I had been dating for 11 years, and became a Mason. A few years later in 2015 our son James was born, whom we named after my grandfather. Then in 2020 we had our second baby, Jane. During these years my Masonic journey was temporarily halted while my young family was developing.

Once my family was established my journey through Masonry continued. It has been an incredible experience filled with the amazing values and traditions of the Fraternity as well as the incredible brotherhood of friends that I have found. As Master of Abraham H. Howland, Jr. Lodge my goal is to honor our past traditions while also forging ahead into a new era of Masonry. My mission statement is to immerse our membership and their families in the values and traditions of our great fraternity. My goal is to connect our families and members with the best aspects of our fraternity through events that promote togetherness, learning, charity, and fun!

Some events that I am excited about include a Table Lodge that will honor the Ladies of the Lodge, as well as a fun fellowship event with our brothers from the Zealous Clays! As a charitable endeavor I have created a challenge coin that honors the legacy of Most Worshipful Abraham H. Howland, Jr. and his contribution to Massachusetts Freemasonry through the establishment of the Masonic Education and Charity Trust. The establishment of this trust supports Grand Lodge programs including the Brotherhood Fund, The Grand Lodge Scholarship Program, The Masonic Medical Research Laboratory, DeMolay and Rainbow, and the Samuel Crocker Lawrence Library. These challenge coins are available for purchase with all the proceeds being donated to the Brotherhood Fund. I am also looking forward to travelling with my officers throughout the

district and enjoying fellowship with all the great Brethren! To all my Masonic Brothers wheresoever dispersed, I wish you a wonderful Masonic year filled with success and joy!

Worshipful Paul Vento **Noquochoke Masonic Lodge**

1.) Please start by telling our little about yourself and your Masonic Journey.

*Be a Mason since 2009. Former Army, former correction officer worked in security. I was raised in Jenks Lodge. I became a brother there because a friend of the family was in that lodge. I was searching for the brotherhood I had in the army. I like the narcissism. After 9 years in masonry, I lost my way in masonry. I tried a motorcycle club for five years. That didn't fit the bill, so I returned to masonry, this time in mass. It being closer to home. Noquochoke turned into my passion, and I wanted to improve and continue the legacy there.

2.) What are your plans for the upcoming Masonic year?

to continue improving Noquochoke and masonry as a whole. This will be accomplished by setting high bars and maintaining the fraternity.

3.) How do you plan to engage brethren in your lodge who have been absent from masonry for a period?

*Noquochoke faces a different road than just reaching out to members who don't attend. It being members who have retired out of state or have left masonry altogether. Well, I agree reaching out to member might entice them to come back, I feel that the focus on this lodge is making new masons and affiliate. We're going to make masonry attractive and worthwhile. This will be done through fellowship, and events including family and friends. Getting back to the basics of freemasonry.

4.) How will you engage family members in lodge dinners and events?

The focus on both events and dinners needs to be on fellowship with brothers and their family members. Stressing focus on a "get what you pay for" mentality. meaning a bit more extra extravagant and luxurious meals rather than a common masonic fair. Giving individuals more pleasure and excitement to come to lodge. Bonding after the meeting with get collation.

5.) What would you like to focus on this upcoming year?

- Squaring away our current membership, making new masons, and being a force to be reckoned with in the 19th West Masonic District.

6.) How will charity in your community play a part in the upcoming year?

*well, we are active posting flags on graves, giving food to the community, charity begins at home. This year needs to be member and hall association focused. Our hope is that we can strengthen our bonds in the community in the upcoming years.

Mount Hope Masonic Lodge

1) Please start by telling us a little about yourself and your Masonic journey.

My Masonic journey really began in childhood. One day, while in my grandparents' basement, I discovered my father's Claudio books and cipher. He explained to me that they were secret—until the day I became a Freemason myself. From that moment on, it seemed I was destined to receive my Lewis Jewel. I was raised in 2012, and I have never looked back.

I live in Fall River and have been married to my wife, Dianna, for 32 years. I was trained as a chef, but always had a passion for finance. I eventually made the leap into becoming a stockbroker and now work as a Financial Advisor.

2) What will your year as Worshipful Master look like?

I feel fortunate to have a strong group of officers to work with, so much of what I hope to accomplish builds on prior years. Membership is very important to me, and I believe we must adapt to connect with later generations. As of now, we have four candidates preparing for their First Degree, which is very exciting. Beyond degree work, I want to see more events for both our Brothers and their spouses, whether at the lodge or at the district level.

3) How do you plan to re-engage brothers who have been away from lodge?

To me, a Brother is always a Brother, even if they've been away for years. We need to find out what it takes to bring them back to lodge on a regular basis. A perfect example is my father, Richard, who stopped attending lodge in the 1980s but is now back with us. Whether it's driving Brothers to lodge or events, or making use of programs like the Rusty Nail, we can ensure returning members once again enjoy the fellowship that first brought them to Masonry.

4) What kind of events would you like to see in the lodge?

I want to expand our events to include not only Brothers but also their spouses and children. For example, we could host family movie nights, game nights in the lodge with board games, popcorn, hot chocolate, or seasonal treats. We might also plan group outings to Providence Bruins games, WooSox baseball, or plays at local theaters. There are so many opportunities to engage the whole family and strengthen our bonds.

5) What do you see as the biggest challenge facing your lodge?

Membership remains our greatest challenge—both in finding new candidates who are a good fit for Mount Hope and in bringing back Brothers who have drifted away. We need to evolve as a lodge to attract younger members, which may mean simple things like offering Venmo or PayPal for dues payments, as well as larger things like creating meaningful events. At the same time, we need to welcome back Brothers who have been away and find ways to make them feel connected again. Balancing both efforts is not easy, but it's essential. Harmony is the strength of the lodge.

6) How do you see the lodge serving the community?

I am a strong believer in giving back. When I was president of the Touro Fraternal Organization, I helped organize monthly visits to the Ronald McDonald House, where we cooked meals for families with children in Hasbro Children's Hospital. I also led efforts to support the Goldie and Chester Kosher Food Pantry and served on the Board of Directors for Jewish Community Services. With that background, I would like to see our lodge expand its presence in the community, offering both manpower and fundraising to meet local needs.
