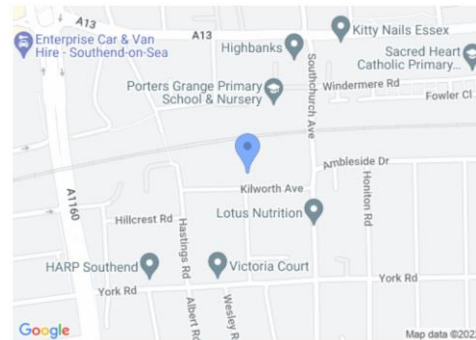

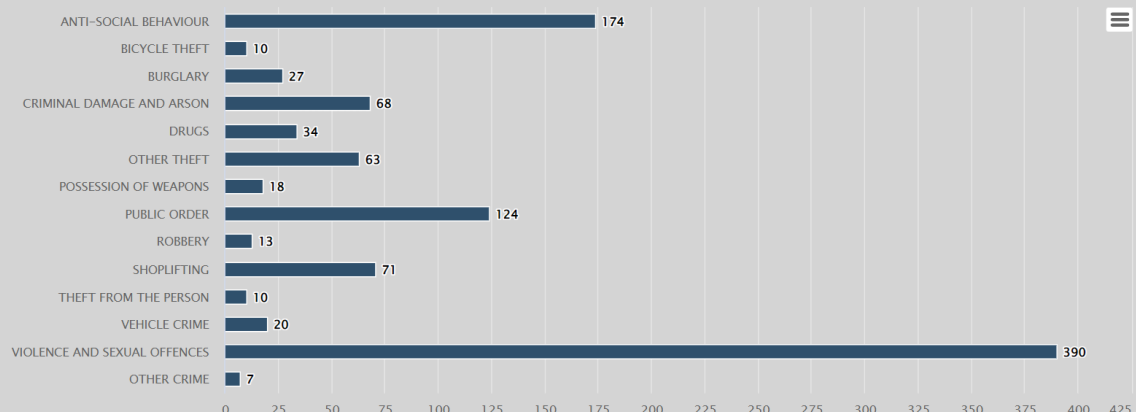

Kilworth Estates Projects Update

Project Green Update

Members of Kilworth Estates approached Cllr Tricia Cowdrey and Cllr Matt Dent during their electioneering campaign in our area, to see if Estuary Housing would consider planting some additional greenery in the enormous front garden of their wonderful old house on the corner of Hastings Road and York Road. Cllr Matt Dent thought this was an excellent idea.

Anne Jones posted to One Voice Queensway East an article from the Woodland Trust, which stated free trees and shrubs are available to communities and members felt that this would be an ideal location. Additional trees and shrubs, would enhance the environment, improve mental health, and help improve air quality, along with other benefits.

Cllr Tricia Cowdrey agreed to raise this proposal at a meeting relating to Estuary's approach to sustainability. Our comments relating to the planting of trees on their sites was positively received and contacting the Woodland Trust will be added to their plans.



Project Paint

Situated on the prominent corner of Southchurch Avenue and Ambleside Drive, this property was sold on 04/02/2022 under SDL auction, on behalf of Bairstow Eves, for the price of £405,000.

Located in the heart of Southend, this large double fronted property, offers sea views along one of Southend's main roads to the seafront, and is laid out with a lower shop front called Bits & Bobs. Its price reflected the fact that it needs redesign and refurbishment. It is exciting to see the external plans, the new owners have for this property. Watch this space...

Project Anti-Social Behaviour

Residents continue to report problems encountered with drug dealing and taking around the streets of the Kilworth estate. The tunnel connecting Hastings Road to Lancaster Crescent still attracts loitering crowds and residents would like to see increased surveillance at the steps from Lancaster Gardens to Grange Gardens.

Numerous instances of fly tipping black sack on pavements continues to present danger to residents using the pavements. If a resident stumbled onto a black sack containing an open can inside, injuries like knife wounds could be sustained.

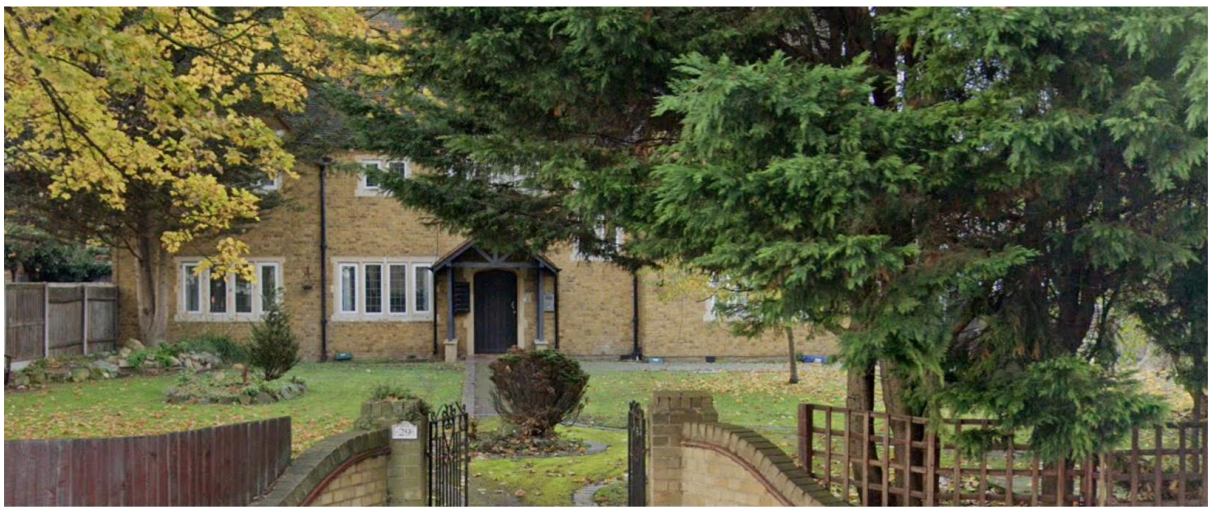
Residents continue to report to the council, front gardens within the Kilworth Estate that are being used as rubbish dumps and give the whole area a look of neglect.

The resident's association understand that some property owners do not provide enough bin store areas for the number of residents within their building.

The decision to amalgamate Project Anti-Social Behaviour and Project Waste Management has been agreed and the website will be updated accordingly.

KILWORTH ESTATE - GRAND BUILDING

St Erkenwald Vicarage





This building was built in 1915 as the clergy house for the church of England church, St Erkenwald, it is situated on the corner of York Road and Honiton Road.

Walter John Taper, the architect of St Erkenwald, designed the church to be clear and bold. The church was built in 1905 but was not completed, it was situated on the corner of Southchurch Avenue and York Road.

The vicarage forms part of the intended but not built quadrangle to the east of the church. Its architecture is a simple and unpretentious cottage style and contrasts with the church which had a strong and formidable ambience. The church was built to be a house of God set apart for divine worship; the vicarage, on the other hand is approachable and clearly relates to the earthly existence of the parishioners.

Following the demolition of St Erkenwald church the old vicarage was used as a domiciliary care facility.

It has since been split into separate flats and some sold on.
