If you are eligible, get your jab as soon as possible.



Art Talk for Mayor's Charities



SOUTHEND BIDS FAREWELL TO SIR DAVID AMESS



Standing together united residents of Southend-on-Sea gave Sir David Amess MP a dignified and respectful send off following a special memorial service for family, friends and invited guests, followed by a horse-drawn procession through the streets.

The service, which was broadcast live on BBC Essex, took place at St Mary's Church, Prittlewell, today (Monday 22 November) and was led by Reverend Paul Mackay and Rev Monsignor Kevin William Hale.

At 12.15 the church bells began tolling, as guests began to arrive for the 1pm service. Beautiful music from organist Melanie van Looy, accompanied by The Southend Boys' and Girls' Choirs, Leigh Orpheus Male Voice Choir and St. Mary's Church Choir, greeted the guests as they took their seats and accompanied them during the service.

Firefighters from Essex County Fire and Rescue acted as pallbearers, carrying Sir David, whose casket was draped with a Union flag, flowers and ceremonial sword, into the church.

Lining the churchyard path were the 3rd Chalkwell Sea Scouts, The Royal Naval Association Standard Bearer and the 1312 Royal Air Force Air Cadet Standard. Members of the public gathered in the churchyard to listen to the service, which included a eulogy from the Right Honourable Mark Francois MP, and readings from Rev Monsignor Kevin William Hale, Rev Clifford Newman, James Duddridge MP, The Worshipful the Mayor Cllr Margaret Borton, and Mrs Jennifer Tolhurst HM Lord-Lieutenant of Essex.

As the service closed, the Right Honourable Ann Widdecombe DSG, read out a statement on behalf of the Amess family, describing how their "hearts are shattered". It read: "The family would like to thank everyone for the wonderful, wonderful tributes paid to David following his cruel and violent death. It truly has brought us so much comfort. The support shown by friends, constituents and the general public alike has been so overwhelming. As a family it has given us strength. We have realised from tributes paid that there was far, far more to David than even we, those closest to him, knew. We are enormously proud of him."

"Strong and courageous is an appropriate way to describe David. He was a patriot and a man of peace. So, we ask people to set aside their differences and show kindness and love to all. This is the only way forward. Set aside hatred and work towards togetherness. Whatever one's race, religious or political beliefs, be tolerant and try to understand."

Following the service, the casket was carried in a horse-drawn hearse through Southend's streets, pausing for a moment of reflection outside the Civic Centre in Victoria Avenue and Iveagh Hall, Sir David's Southend West Constituency office, in Leigh Road.

The Book of Condolence in the Jubilee Room at the Civic Centre, which was opened in the days following Sir David's death will close for written tributes at 19.00 today (Monday 22 November).

There will be a Requiem Mass for Sir David on Tuesday 23 November at Westminster Cathedral.

Sir David's family has kindly requested that in lieu of flowers or other tributes, donations are made to the many charities Sir David passionately and wholeheartedly supported. These include; The Dog's Trust, The Music Man Project, Prost8, Endometriosis UK, Havens Hospices and the Dame Vera Lynn Memorial Statue. Glenhurst Mansions

Now that Southend has been granted City Status, it must be time to smarten up some of Old Southend's buildings. We have decided to run a series featuring grand old building within our Estate. This month the chosen building is Glenhurst Mansions, this block was built around 1900's and has a striking resemblance to number 10 Downing Street.

It is believed that some of the owners have links to the Roslin Hotel, one of Southend's best-known hotels and Weston development company. Glenhurst Mansions is situated along the same stretch of Southchurch Road as Montague Buildings featured last month.

The artist has imagined Glenhurst Mansions has had an external renovation and members of KERA have put in a request to Southend Council to investigate the possibility of planting some hedges along this stretch of road, to demark the boundary between the public highway pavement and the front gardens of Glenhurst Mansions.



LEST WE FORGET - REMEMBRANCE DAY SERVICE

Southend sea sewage spill protest this Friday



INFURIATED swimmers are holding a demonstration as they enter the second weak of being unable to enter the sea following a sewage leak.

<u>Southend</u> beach has been closed from Chalkwell to Shoeburyness since October 21 due to sewage spilling into the sea from an outfall – a pipe leading into the sea – near Camper Road.

On Friday, November 1 angry swimmers and environmental campaigners will make their voices heard, heading from the Sealife Adventure in Eastern Esplanade at 1pm to the council offices in Victoria Avenue. The group will be calling for the council to take action over the spillage caused by 'significant blockage' in a sewer pipe that feeds Anglian Water's Southend Water Recycling Centre.

Southend Council has formally written to the water firm demanding a face-to-face meeting to discuss both the sewage leak and water surface flooding along the seafront.

Southend resident and member of Southend Seals swimming group Shah Haider said: "We, like many other swimmers in the area have been affected by what has happened with Anglian Water and the sea.

"We are sick of it, because we swim throughout the year, and we are very aware of this sewage issue. For the last two weeks we have not been able to swim, we have not been able to go into the sea, because it has become a sewer, basically."

The 48-year-old added: "We live along the seafront and we have found a dead seagull, friends of ours have found several seagulls. When the original spill happened, we were actually swimming while it happened.

"At first we didn't notice, but we did see the seagulls take off and fly away and they didn't come back for at least three days. That was a precursor to what we could see in the changing environment."

An Anglian Water spokesperson: "We haven't had an incident like this for more than a decade, and our teams are working round the clock to put things right. Repairing this is a significant engineering challenge, made harder by how deep under the ground it is and is our main priority at this time.

"Over the last five years, we've invested around £20million into refurbishing and improving the sewer network and water recycling centre in Southend. Earlier this year we cleaned and inspected 80km of sewers in the, investing around £370k and removing 200 tonnes of unflushables from the network, which would reduce the risk of flooding in the area."

Southend Firework Display Continues during November




