This graphic provides some helpful advice on what *cannot* be recycled in the food waste bins, the pink recycling sacks and blue box for paper and card.

- Polystyrene
- Nappies and sanitary ware
- Batteries
- Hard plastic
- Food waste
- Mirror
- Newspaper and magazines
- Small electricals

No thanks, do not put this in your blue box for paper and card

- Carrier bags
- Glittery, waxed or shiny wrapping paper
- Food contaminated paper and card (such as greasy take away pizza boxes)
- Coffee and take away cup
