At the bottom of each page is a box to tick when you're done. Completing this book will earn you a reward! Talk to a grown-up and decide together what your reward will be:



#### **About Autism**

There are lots of amazing things about being autistic.




### It's okay to find things hard

Alex and Billy's parents have learned a few ways to help Alex when they find things hard.

# Let's spend a day with Alex and Billy!



### In the morning

Sometimes Alex can get worried when they don't know what's going to happen in the future.

In the morning, Alex and Mum talk through the plan for the day together. It helps Alex to feel prepared and relaxed!

### Walking to school

If you are autistic, you might find that you have super-senses. You might hear things that other people think are quiet, or have a really good sense of smell. Wow!

Sometimes these super-senses can be overwhelming. Things that Billy doesn't notice might be uncomfortable or annoying for Alex.

#### In the classroom


Autistic people sometimes find it hard to be around lots of people or in noisy places. You can always talk to a teacher if you feel uncomfortable.

School can be fun too, especially if your autism gives you super skills! Let's see what Alex thinks of school:

What's your favourite subject?




Alex has a new teacher this year. They still feel a bit uncomfortable with the change.

### In the playground

School is a great place to make friends!

Alex sometimes finds it difficult to play with other children, but they have found some helpful tips for making friends:



Alex loves talking about their hobbies. Sometimes they need to remember to ask their friends questions too.

What question could you ask your friend?



Alex's behaviour might confuse people. Alex explains that it is just a way of expressing themself.




Alex finds it hard to understand how other people feel. Grown-ups say the best thing to do is just to ask them!



Sometimes it can be hard to understand how other people are feeling. But we can look at the expressions on someone's face to give us a clue about their emotions!





### Change of plan

A change of plan can be difficult, but it can also be fun!

Alex's mum needs to go to the shops after school. Alex didn't expect this, so they start to feel nervous. Mum knows that Alex will be calmer if they have something to keep them busy:



How do you feel when you are not sure about something? A grown-up could help you think about this.



Alex's special mission in the shops is to find 3 important ingredients for dinner.

Can you help Alex find the 3 ingredients from the list?

#### **Back at home**

Sometimes autistic children can find it difficult to understand how to take turns and share. That's okay! Taking turns is something we can practice, and get better at it.

When the twins play games together, Alex needs to wait when it's Billy's turn. So, Alex does something fun while they wait for their next turn!



What could you do that is fun while you are waiting your turn?
