

Get Your Career in Gear with GEAR UP

The Santa Cruz County School Superintendent's Office and the Gear Up Program are preparing for FAFSA season! As the Class of 2024 prepare for their post-secondary education, Gear Up staff offer services to support students and families with financial planning and college admissions. Federal student aid, scholarships, and work study applications can be intimidating, however, there is plenty of assistance at all five county high schools.

What is the FAFSA form and why should I fill it out?

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form is used to apply for federal student aid programs such as federal grants, work-study funds, and loans. Filling out the online form is one of the most important steps students and their families can take to help pay for college. Nearly all students who apply qualify for some form of federal financial aid. The Gear Up team has been "geared up" to assist students and their families with the process!

Changes to the FAFSA has pushed back the release date. The redesigned FAFSA is expected to launch by December 31st, 2023 for the 2024 – 2025 academic year. The new changes aim to make completing the form easier and also expands eligibility for many types of student aid. Students will be eligible to receive up to \$7,395 in federal grant money – money that does not have to be repaid – for college.

Some changes include:

- 1. Everyone who wants to enter information into an online FAFSA account will need an FSA ID to access the form. This means each student and parent (parent which provides the greater portion of the student's financial support) will need their own FSA ID to fill out the form.
- 2. NO Social Security Number new process, including parents who are undocumented, to create an FSA ID. Once an individual's identity has been verified through TransUnion, they should immediately receive an FSA ID and be able to proceed with the FAFSA application process.
- 3. The application is now available in 11 languages.
- 4. Everyone has to click a permission box to allow financial information to be transferred from the IRS, including non-tax-filers.
- 5. Student will be able to add up to 20 colleges on the application.
- 6. Only families with an Adjusted Gross Income greater than \$60,000 will be required to report asset information.

How can Gear Up and the C-CREO Hub help?

The C-CREO Hub is a college and career access center designed to be a one-stop shop for all things post-secondary. Whether your path leads to university, community college, military, or the workforce, staff will assist in the planning and supply the tools necessary to navigate through applications. The goal of Gear Up is to assist students to enroll in a post-secondary program and complete it.

The C-CREO Hub will be hosting a FAFSA-THON starting January 3rd – February 7th, 2024. Stop by the Hub every Wednesday from 8:00 am-6:30 pm or make an appointment to fill out your FAFSA application and prepare for post-secondary pathways (scholarship searches, college applications, career and college exploration and military information). Every Wednesday snacks, coffee and water will be provided, and we will be open late to better accommodate and serve our families.

Appointments are also available and recommended, however walk-ins are always welcome. Monday-Friday (8:00 am-5:00 pm.) To Make an Appointment with the HUB visit https://calendly.com/ccreohub

The criteria for eligible students include: GPA of 3.5 or higher.

PSAT/NMSQT or PSAT 10 assessment scores that are within the top 10% of assessment takers in each state for each award program or earned a score of 3 or higher on 2 or more AP Exams in 9th and 10th grade.


Attend school in a rural area or small town, or identify as African American/Black, Hispanic American/Latino, or Indigenous/Native.

Eligible students are invited to apply on BigFuture during their sophomore or junior year and are awarded at the start of the next school year in time to share their achievements in high school as they plan for the future. At the same time, colleges and organizations using College Board's Student Search ServiceTM can connect directly with awardees during the recruitment process.

"It's becoming increasingly hard for students to be 'seen' during the college recruitment process. We're exceptionally proud of the National Recognition Programs for celebrating students who are at times overlooked but have shown their outstanding academic abilities," said Tarlin Ray, senior vice president of BigFuture® at College Board. 

Let's Talk Health

The American Cance Society released updated lung cancer screening guidelines this year, 2023. Yearly screenings with low-dose CT scan for people at increased risk of lung cancer. What is increased risk?

Age: 50-80 years old and in good health. Did you know Medicare covers screening up to age 77 and most private insurance covers up to age 80.

Do you now smoke or in the past smoke? People who currently smoke or have smoked in the past should be screened. For smokers, to bacco smoking history is important. At least 20 pack=years: this means one pack a year is equal to smoking one pack per day for one year. (1 pack=20 cigarettes). People should not be screened if they have serious health problems that will likely limit how long they will live, or if they don't want any treatment for lung cancer if it is found.

If you smoke and want to learn more about quitting, contact Alexa Lopez at Mariposa's Community Health Services Department, 520 875-6050 ext. 1353, she can help connect you with the Arizona Ash Line and a quit coach to help you. Quitting smoking can greatly help you reduce the risk of lung cancer.

If you are interested in getting screened, speak with your provider now, call Mariposa Community Health Center at 520 281-1550 to schedule an appointment.

Recommendations for Lung Cancer Screening



The American Cancer Society recommends yearly screening for lung cancer for people with a smoking history.

Screening Eligibility

- Adults 50 to 90 years old
- Currently smoke prused to smoke
- Have a 20 or more pack-year history. JA pack-year is equal to smoking 1 pack or about 20 cigarettes per day for a year.

Before Getting Screened

- Talk to a health care professional about your risk for lung cancer and the benefits, I mitations, and harms of low-dose CT II OCD symposium.
- People who currently smoke should receive smoking cessation treatment.
