October Design Tip

Let's talk about ways to <u>maximize natural light</u> in your home. As the weather gets cooler and the sun sets earlier, it can feel darker in our homes. And while the instinct may to be to turn that overhead lighting on full blast - here are some other ways to let the light in without giving you a headache:

- Reflective surfaces I use this tip when working on basements where natural light is scarce (but you can do this anywhere).
 Using a glossy finish paint and some strategically place mirrors can make a big difference to maximize light in the room so you don't have to keep the overhead canned lights on full blast. Move around some mirrors or put a few together on a mantle and it will feel brighter;
- <u>Dimmers If you are getting any overhead lighting installed,</u> make sure they are <u>all</u> on dimmers (despite what design advice your electrician may be giving you). Dimming the overhead light will allow the natural light to filter in.
- Sheer or Light Filtering Window Treaments Blackout curtains are great for bedrooms but that's where I draw the line. Getting window treatments that are light filtering will allow some light to come in while also giving you the privacy you might be looking for.
