## March Design Tip

Seasonal decorating doesn't have to be cliche. Here are some tips for bringing spring freshness into your home without being too obvious.

- Swap heavy textures for lighter ones. Velvet pillows and fur throws in your living spaces can be stored away to make room for lighter fabrics like linen and cotton. Clean and store down comforters and replace with quality cotton quilts on beds once the weather is warm enough.
- Add plants! So many people are afraid of house plants but there are lots of low maintenance ones that are really easy to keep alive. Pothos plants and snake plants are both practically impossible to kill...take it from someone who has never fertilized her snake plant and lets it go up to six weeks with no water. It's survived again and again. Fiddle leaf figs are notoriously fickle but such a showstopper when you can make them work. This plant food is a game changer for keeping a fiddle leaf fig tree thriving and works to keep any plant healthy and happy. If you've been hesitant to try a live plant start with an easy care one and see how it goes. They add literal life to a room!
- Use colored glassware or patterned napkins when hosting. These don't
  have to be expensive! Crate and Barrel has <u>pretty colored glass</u>
  <u>drinkware</u> starting at just \$5.95 a glass and World Market is a great
  source for <u>fun napkins</u>. We think these <u>red and blue fish print napkins</u> are
  so cute and whimsical and also love these <u>purple and green block print</u>
  ones.
