
### Positive Mindset

### April Design Tip

Window treatments are one of those finishing touches in a room that really make a design look fully complete and polished. Here are three of our favorite kinds of window treatments and where we like to use them.

- Patterned roman shades. We love these to add a little color and personality
  to kitchen windows, where you sometimes don't have a lot of color or pattern
  otherwise. They're also functional if you have kitchen windows that are east or
  west facing and sun can be glaring during certain times of day. We also love
  this look in bedrooms if you don't have space for drapes or otherwise don't
  care for full length drapes in a bedroom.
- Pleated drapes. This kind of window treatment can be used anywhere. They're great in a living room, family room, dining room, bedroom, even a primary bathroom if you're feeling fancy. We always recommend a pleated drape, either a french pleat or a pinch pleat are our favorites. Grommet drapes can look dated and bunching a curtain on a rod pocket doesn't do any justice to the curtain. Good quality drapes are a little bit of an investment but well worth it, and if you don't have room in your budget for custom drapes, there are many ready-to-order stores that sell neutral, good quality pleated drapes that cost much less than custom.
- Woven blinds. These can be paired with drapes for a layered look or to add some texture. We also love a woven or rattan blind in a bathroom for privacy and softness in a room that is mostly hard surfaces.
