BAPTISM AT HAGERSVILLE (FOLLOW INSERT)

SCRIPTURE READING: John 20:1–18

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. ² So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!"

³ So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. ⁴ Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb

running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. ⁵ He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there but did not go in. ⁶ Then Simon Peter came along behind him and went straight into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, ⁷ as well as the cloth that had been wrapped around Jesus' head. The cloth was still lying in its place, separate from the linen. ⁸ Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. ⁹ (They still did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead.) ¹⁰ Then the disciples went back to where they were staying.

Jesus Appears to Mary Magdalene

¹¹ Now Mary stood outside the tomb crying. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb ¹² and saw two angels in white, seated where Jesus' body had been, one at the head and the other at the foot.

¹³ They asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?"

"They have taken my Lord away," she said, "and I don't know where they have put him." ¹⁴ At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus.

¹⁵ He asked her, "Woman, why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?"

Thinking he was the gardener, she said, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him."

16 Jesus said to her, "Mary."

She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which means "Teacher").

¹⁷ Jesus said, "Do not hold on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father. Go instead to my brothers and tell them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.""

¹⁸ Mary Magdalene went to the disciples with the news: "I have seen the Lord!" And she told them that he had said these things to her.

SERMON: "From the Garden to Glory"

He Is Risen!

Such incredible, miraculous, life-changing words.

"He is not here; he has risen, just as he said..." Matthew 28:6 His power could not be contained in a grave. His love could not be conquered by death. His truth could never be buried and forgotten.

Jesus Christ rose again, He is Victorious!

Let us step back for a moment to Mary

Mary Magdalene came to the tomb while it was still dark. That detail is important—it tells us not just about the time of day, but about the state of her soul. She carried grief, confusion, fear. She had watched Jesus die, and now even His body was gone.

Her reaction is human—she weeps. She doesn't recognize the angels. She doesn't recognize Jesus. Sometimes, our pain can blind us to the presence of God.

But everything changes when Jesus says her name: "Mary."

That single word changes her world. It is the voice of love, the voice of recognition, the voice of life. The resurrection isn't just about Jesus rising—it's about us being raised to new hope, new understanding, new purpose.

Notice what Jesus tells her: "Go and tell." The resurrection always comes with a mission. Mary becomes the first preacher of the risen Christ.

And what about us? We, too, may come to Easter with burdens. Maybe we are living in that same "before sunrise" place of doubt or grief. But Christ is alive. He speaks our names too. And when He does, He lifts us from shadows to light, from sorrow to joy.

This is the heart of Easter: God's love is stronger than death.

The tomb could not hold Him.

Our sin cannot stop Him.

No stone is too heavy, no night too dark.

And He makes all things new.

The very purpose of this Easter weekend reminds us, that no matter what we've been through in the past, what we might be facing today, or

what uncertainties tomorrow may hold, Christ alone is our Hope. He conquered death, He rose from the grave, He is all Powerful.

He breathes new life, so that we can live...free.

We have so much to celebrate today, for He has risen!

He has risen indeed!

Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. And because of that, we are never alone, never without hope, never beyond new life.

So go, like Mary. Go and tell. The world needs to hear this joy. Amen
