MESSAGE: A Travel Guide to Jesus

Have you ever tried to take a trip without a map, a GPS, or even directions scribbled on a napkin? It doesn't usually go well. You miss turns, end up on bumpy back roads, or discover you're heading the wrong way altogether. You know every trip needs a map.

A good trip starts with a map. Without it, we wander.

For us as Christians, Scripture is the map. It gives us stories, wisdom, and guidance. It shows us the big picture of where we're going, toward God's love and eternal life.

Let's think about this a map on its own doesn't really help much, you've got to know where you are first. It's the same with Scripture, we need to understand what it means and the direction it will take us. It is a the same with a map can tell us the roads, but sometimes the roads get confusing, and you literally start turning the map in different directions (whether it helps or not). It is the same with scripture, Jesus doesn't just hand us a rulebook, the bible and say, "Good luck out there." He says: Follow me. Walk with me. I am the way.

That means we're not alone. He is not just showing us the path; He is the path. When we get lost, He is the voice saying, "This is the way ... walk in it."

Then the best way to describe what it means to have Jesus walking the journey with us is this.... every journey needs or has companion, because, no one wants to travel alone. Road trips are better with friends, hikes are easier with company, and life is richer when shared.

That's why Jesus gives us the church, the community of fellow travelers. We need each other when we get tired, when we lose our way, or when we just need someone to laugh with on the road.

The disciples traveled together, and so do we. Companions help us keep going when the road feels too long. They even lift us up and carry us when we are tired. Then I started thinking about this journey we are on, this journey of life, and I thought to myself every journey has detours....

Let's be honest: no trip goes exactly as planned. There are construction zones, wrong turns, flat tires, and the occasional "I thought you said to turn left!" moments.

Life is the same. There are illnesses, losses, broken relationships, or times when we feel far from God.

But here's the good news: Jesus knows how to guide us through the detours. Even when we think we're far off course, He can re-route us and bring us back to the path of grace.

But, sometimes the detours are where we discover the most important lessons of faith. What I call the awe—ha moments. Isn't that so true in life, roads that we never expected to travel take us to places where we discover something beautiful and then pause I find our way back on the right road.

And then there is the destination. The destination matters in life as much as the journey we go on. Remember this though at the end of John 14, Jesus assures His disciples that He is preparing a place for them. The destination is God's promise for them, eternal life, love without end. But along the way, He reminds them not to be troubled. Don't rush past the journey. Because every step with Jesus, every act of kindness, every moment of grace, every laugh shared is, part of the joy of the road. The Christian life isn't just about where we're going; it's about who we are becoming as we travel with Jesus.

So, as Christian's who are always travelling, what's in your "*Travel Guide to Jesus*"? For me

- A map \rightarrow God's Word.
- A guide \rightarrow Jesus Himself.
- Companions → the community of faith.
- Detours → opportunities for trust and growth.
- A destination \rightarrow life with God, both now and forever.

Friends, as we set out on the road ahead, whether it's smooth or rocky, long or short, let's remember that we don't walk alone, we have a travel guide in Jesus and with Jesus on our journey, every step matters. And remember as we journey with Jesus as our guide, pack light, hold onto hope, and don't forget to enjoy the view. Amen.
