SCRIPTURE READINGS: Psalm 71:1-6; Jeremiah 1:1-10 **Jeremiah 1:1-10**

The Call of Jeremiah

⁴ The word of the LORD came to me, saying,

⁵ "Before I formed you in the womb I knew^[a] you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations."

⁶ "Alas, Sovereign LORD," I said, "I do not know how to speak; I am too young."

⁷ But the LORD said to me, "Do not say, 'I am too young.' You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you. ⁸ Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you," declares the LORD.

⁹ Then the LORD reached out his hand and touched my mouth and said to me, "I have put my words in your mouth. ¹⁰ See, today I appoint you over nations and kingdoms to uproot and tear down, to destroy and overthrow, to build and to plant."

MESSAGE: "God's Got Big Plans for You!"

Imagine you're a teenager, just trying to figure out life, and one day God shows up and says, "I've got a job for you." That's exactly what happened to Jeremiah. He was young—probably a teenager—when God told him, "Before you were even born, I had a plan for your life. I made you to do something important: to tell people what I want them to hear." Jeremiah didn't feel ready at all. He said, "But God, I'm too young! I don't know how to speak like that." And God basically replied, "Don't worry about that. I'll give you the words to say. You don't have to be afraid of anyone, because I'm going to be with you every step of the way."

Then God did something really cool—He touched Jeremiah's mouth. This was God's way of saying, "Now my words will be your words." God told Jeremiah.

God reassures Jeremiah that his age, inexperience, or fear will not hinder the mission. The promise "I am with you" echoes throughout Scripture (e.g., Moses, Joshua, and Jesus' Great Commission). It emphasizes that God's presence is what enables success, not human capability.

"You're going to have a tough job. Sometimes you'll have to tell people things they don't want to hear—things that will tear down their pride or their bad habits. But you'll also tell them about the good things I want to build in their lives."

God not only calls Jeremiah but also empowers him, symbolized by the touching of his mouth. Jeremiah's words will carry divine authority. In

verse 10, God declares Jeremiah's mission: to uproot and tear down what is corrupt while planting and building what is good. This reflects both judgment and restoration, key themes of Jeremiah's prophetic ministry.

So what does this passage mean for us today....in 2025

Well, God has a purpose for you, Just like Jeremiah, you're not here by accident. God made you with a plan in mind, even if you don't see it yet. And you have to be perfect, Jeremiah thought he wasn't good enough because he was young and inexperienced. But God doesn't choose people because they're perfect; He chooses people who are willing, and then He helps them do the job.

You know life can be scary no matter what age we are, and a call from God to do his work, can even add to what expectations God has for you. Think about when you were young, especially when you felt like you're not ready for something big. Like you going tod work for the first time, going to college or university, moving away from home, sharing your faith with others. But in all of that, God promises to be with us, to give us strength and courage.

As Jeremiah grew as a servant of God, he had to say tough things, but they were important for helping people grow and turn back to God. It is the same way in life, speaking the truth, especially about what's right, might not always make you popular, but it can make a real difference. God told Jeremiah he would "tear down" before he could "build up." That's how life works too, sometimes we have to let go of bad habits or unhealthy ways of thinking to make room for something better. I truly believe that God knows and chooses us with a purpose, even before we understand it ourselves.

Sometimes, I know that all of us feel that we are just human or inadequate to do the job, but this no obstacle for God's power. Jeremiah's age and inexperience are irrelevant because God is the one working through him.

The assurance "I am with you" reminds us that we never go alone in fulfilling our calling. Jeremiah's ministry would involve confronting sin, calling for repentance, and bringing hope for renewal. Just as Jeremiah was chosen for a specific role, God has a plan for each of us. When God calls us, He equips us and walks with us, giving us courage to step into the unknown, to overcome fear. Still uncertain about where God is calling you?

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Think About It This Way:

Imagine a coach who sees a kid with a lot of potential. The kid might say, "I'm not ready for this!" but the coach says, "I see something in you that you don't see in yourself yet. Trust me, I'll help you every step of the way." That's what God was saying to Jeremiah, and that's what God says to us.
