Couples commonly have a "song" which commemorates some part of their relationship (first date, anniversary, proposal, wedding etc.)

"I think music in itself is healing," American musician Billy Joel once said. "It's an explosive expression of humanity. It's something we are all touched by. No matter what culture we're from, everyone loves music." Most of us would wholeheartedly agree with this statement, and it is this universal bond with music that has led researchers across the globe to investigate its therapeutic potential.

Music is also a powerful method of delivering messages. Companies commonly use music to advertise their products. With all the technology available to us, one of the most effective advertising methods is still the good old-fashioned jingle. Why? Because when people hear a catchy song, they remember it, along

with the message or product that goes with it.

And in the world of advertising, memorable equals successful.

Music can make us feel excited, scared, to think, to laugh, to breath and feel a presence around us.

So where does faith and music fit together...

Music and faith was right there in the beginning ...

Psalm 150:1-6 Praise the LORD!

Praise God in his heavenly dwelling; praise him in his mighty heaven! 2Praise him for his mighty works; praise his unequaled greatness! 3Praise him with a blast of the trumpet; praise him with the lyre and harp!

4Praise him with the tambourine and dancing; praise him with stringed instruments and flutes!

5Praise him with a clash of cymbals; praise him with loud clanging cymbals.

6Let everything that lives sing praises to the LORD! Praise the LORD! Music and faith has brought people through times of trouble, times of war, times of being uprooted. That is why we have so many beautiful hymns of celebration.

But music's role as a social glue can also be seen in work songs sung by slaves, sea shanties among sailors, and soldiers' chants. People in prison. Music, it seems, really does bond us closely.

Lying at the heart of our relationships in this way, it makes sense that music would tug at the heartstrings, helping us to create an emotional connection. Each culture may then build on this basic instinct, creating their own music of certain chords or ideas that come to be associated with particular feelings. Whatever its early origins, today we can't help but associate certain music with the most important events in our lives. It is the soundtrack of conception, pregnancy, births, marriages, and funerals, and everything in between. No wonder we open ourselves to the array of feelings and memories whenever we hear our favorite tunes.

With all this being said and shared, the church is based on the celebration of God through Music.

Music helps the worshipful embody the full range of our spiritual experience, from gratitude and joy to humility and even to our sorrow over sin.

The great evangelist D.L. Moody said, "There is more to be said in the Bible about praise than prayer, and music and song have not only accompanied all scriptural revivals, but are essential in deepening spiritual life." Church music has great impact.

Worship is focused adoration and devotion to God. It requires the engagement of the mind and the heart to the Lord at the exclusion of all else. Singing can certainly lead us into worship. Psalm 66:4 says, "All the earth shall worship thee, and shall sing unto thee; they shall sing to thy name." Good music can help seal off distractions, and get you prepared in mind and spirit to receive from the Lord. Certainly, we have great reason for music in our church services!

Music does bring people together. It allows us to experience the same emotions. People everywhere are the same in heart and spirit. No matter what language we speak, what color we are, the form of our politics or the expression of our love and our faith, music proves: We are the same.
