SCRIPTURE READINGS: 1 Samuel 3:1-10 (11-20); John 1:43-51 The LORD Calls Samuel

³ The boy Samuel ministered before the LORD under Eli. In those days the word of the LORD was rare; there were not many visions.

² One night Eli, whose eyes were becoming so weak that he could barely see, was lying down in his usual place. ³ The lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the house of the LORD, where the ark of God was. ⁴ Then the LORD called Samuel.

Samuel answered, "Here I am." ⁵ And he ran to Eli and said, "Here I am; you called me."

But Eli said, "I did not call; go back and lie down." So he went and lay down.

Jesus Calls Philip and Nathanael

⁴³ The next day Jesus decided to leave for Galilee. Finding Philip, he said to him, "Follow me."

⁴⁴ Philip, like Andrew and Peter, was from the town of Bethsaida. ⁴⁵ Philip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the

one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets also wrote—Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."

- ⁴⁶ "Nazareth! Can anything good come from there?" Nathanael asked. "Come and see," said Philip.
- ⁴⁷ When Jesus saw Nathanael approaching, he said of him, "Here truly is an Israelite in whom there is no deceit."
- ⁴⁸ "How do you know me?" Nathanael asked.

Jesus answered, "I saw you while you were still under the fig tree before Philip called you."

- ⁴⁹ Then Nathanael declared, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God; you are the king of Israel."
- ⁵⁰ Jesus said, "You believe^[a] because I told you I saw you under the fig tree. You will see greater things than that." ⁵¹ He then added, "Very truly I tell you,^[b] you^[c] will see 'heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending on'^[d] the Son of Man."

MESSAGE: Come and See

Fred Craddock has observed that the "biblical word central to the Season of Epiphany is 'revelation', for this is the time we celebrate the revealing of the Son of God. But the companion word to revelation is 'witness', for revelation in the biblical sense is never open and obvious to everyone, interested or not, believer or not."

These words seem especially relevant to the text for the day, Philip's witness to Nathanael. Philip is unable to prove what he believed he had found in Jesus, but he is able to say at least, "Come and see." What Philip sees moves him to help others to see Jesus to want to help them, anyway, whether they do or do not see.

The season of Epiphany is the "moment" of God's self-revelation to the world, the season following Christmas, prompts us to ask... How will we witness? How will we reveal that which has been revealed to us? Therefore, we ask the question So how does God want us to witness? Will we hear his call? Will it be clear like Samuel? And when we do, with, what kind of style do we spread the faith?

Remember ... Witness Is Not Technique, but Touch

In our denominations these days there is much discussion about church growth. Much of the discussion is framed in such a way that we need to draw people in with gimmicks and promotions; but I must confess that most often it sounds more like marketing. In society today, there are

many new ways of worship in alternative forms, almost like a theater production ... I think you know what I mean. And it may be great stuff, really, for this age in which we live ... BUT

My fear is the word of God, the message of faith being lost in the performance. Some will say, No, but I have been questioned about this and I am wondering how you hear the still small voice of God, calling, speaking, asking Come and See.

Yes, the music and the performance can move you, but like any performance does the real message come through? You know saving souls is a long and laborious process. For Jesus it took miracles, telling parables and most of all being an example (Christ like) to others. For us it takes reading and listening to the bible, understanding what is expected of us from Jesus. Most of all loving, sharing, caring, showing grace and reaching out.

My suspicion is that when the excitement over this latest trend of techniques fades, we will be left with the time-honored and tested example we have before us today. If we really want to be disciples of Jesus, if we want to be real evangelists, we may need to do it the old fashion way find a friend or stranger, and say, "Come and see." Also witness Is Faithfulness

Looking at todays, new testament reading.....Who is Nathanael that Philip, or Jesus, wants to have him along? After all, he seems somewhat prejudiced, ready to condemn Jesus on account of his address and accent. So, what's the purpose of this story?

Perhaps it is an example ... a "go and do thou likewise" kind of story. Perhaps it is encouragement to those of us who are believers to begin witnessing: not by pressuring or arguing, ridiculing or belittling. Rather, as Philip was called and then went calling, the text is a summons to us to witness, to invite, to speak the truth of our faith's experience even to those for whom the invitation may sound strange. If we are faithful as Philip was faithful, God can claim the disbelieving, even as Nathanael was claimed.

And perhaps it is a reminder, too, that even we who now believe once did not, that at one time we were no better off than Nathanael. But as he heard and believed, so others have heard and believed through him. So too will our faith be shared with others if we hear and believe. Remember, Jesus called Philip, and Philip responded by witnessing to Nathanael. When we hear the faithful word of God, and God's summons

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us to discipleship, we will want to take others with us. But, we need to hear that call, to each of you that call has been and will be different. When we have heard the word, then we will be not only like Philip, but also like Peter, James, and John, who in Acts 4:20 say, "we cannot keep from speaking about what we have seen and heard." When people ask us, "What's going on with you people at the church?" we can answer, "Come and see."
