SCRIPTURE READINGS

Mark 6:30-32

³⁰ The apostles gathered around Jesus and reported to him all they had done and taught. ³¹ Then, because so many people were coming and going that they did not even have a chance to eat, he said to them, "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest." ³² So they went away by themselves in a boat to a solitary place.

Matthew 14:13 – Jesus withdrew to a deserted place after hearing hard news.

Luke 5:16 – Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed.

MESSAGE: "Did Jesus Take Vacations?"

Summer is here. I heard that different times this week when the temperatures were hitting the high 20's....yes today is the first day of summer!!

The kids are almost out of school, soon the roads are full of RVs and campers and well it's vacation season. A time for hammocks, flip-flops, lakeside sunsets, and maybe, for the lucky among us, a few days away from emails, responsibilities, and cooking dinner.

Which leads us to the question I want us to think about today: Did Jesus take vacations?

It may sound a little silly at first. We don't often imagine Jesus in sandals with a beach towel over his shoulder, sipping lemonade under a palm tree. But the deeper question is worth asking:

Did Jesus take time to rest? And if he did ... what does that mean for us?

Jesus Needed Rest too, our scriptures this morning paint a clear picture:

- In **Mark 6**, after the disciples returned from a busy mission, Jesus said: "Come away to a quiet place and rest awhile."
- In **Matthew 14**, Jesus withdrew after hearing the heartbreaking news of John the Baptist's death.
- And in Luke 5, we read that "Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed."

In other words, yes Jesus took time away.

Now, he may not have booked a resort or flown south for the winter, but he did intentionally step back. He paused, he rested, he breathed, and he reconnected with God.

Even the Son of God needed space to recharge. That's powerful.

In today's society, we often treat rest as a reward, something you earn after a long stretch of productivity. But in the life of Jesus, rest wasn't a luxury. It was a rhythm. A holy rhythm.

Jesus didn't wait until everything was perfect to pull away. He often stepped aside when the crowds were still needy, when the disciples still had questions, when there was still more work to be done.

He knew what we so often forget: we nee to rest and recharge.

You don't have to finish everything before you take a break.

God is still God, even when you're napping.

In fact, the very first thing God did after creating the world was rest. The seventh day, Sabbath...is not a suggestion. It's part of the divine rhythm.

I love that many of Jesus' most meaningful moments happen in slow, restful settings.

He walked by the water. He climbed a hill. He sat at tables. He told stories. He went boating ... granted, the disciples probably hoped it was more of a cruise and less of a storm survival situation.

Even his miracles weren't rushed. Jesus moved at the pace of love. Not hustle. Not pressure. Love.

So, What About Us?

If Jesus needed rest, if he took time to retreat, refresh, and renew, then surely, we can too.

Summer invites us into a slower pace.

To open the windows. To listen to birdsong. To taste a ripe tomato. To laugh with our kids or grandkids. To go fishing, walking, berrypicking, or just sit on the back deck and do nothing without guilt. And in doing these things, we are not wasting time, we are honoring God.

As writer Wayne Muller puts it:

"If we do not allow for a rhythm of rest in our overly busy lives, illness becomes our Sabbath—our pneumonia, our heart attack, our accidents." God does not ask us to run ourselves into the ground in the name of faith.

God invites us to breathe, play, rest, and be present.

So, we come to the answer to our question ... Did Jesus take a vacation??

No, Jesus didn't take a vacation to the cottage or go to Disney. But yes, he *absolutely* took time away to rest and recharge.

He shows us that rest isn't selfish.

It's sacred.

It's part of how we live a full and faithful life.

This summer, take your rest seriously, whether that's a week away, or just sitting on deck, sharing a bonfire with family and friends, looking a summer night sky, full of stars, Watching a thunder storm on your porch, or five quiet minutes with a cup of tea.

And as you do, may you remember:

You're following in the footsteps of Jesus.

Even when those footsteps are leading to a hammock.

Amen.
