SCRIPTURE READING: John 15:1-8

The Vine and the Branches

15 "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ² He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes^[a] so that it will be even more fruitful. ³ You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴ Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.

⁵ "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers;

such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. ⁷ If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.

MESSAGE: The Road of Transformation: Abiding in Christ **Scripture:** John 15:1-8

Life is a journey, and as Christians, our road is one of transformation. Jesus calls us not to stay the same, but to grow, change, and become more like Him. But how does that transformation happen? Do we simply try harder? Do we push ourselves to be better? No—Jesus tells us that transformation happens by abiding in Him.

In John 15:1-8, Jesus uses a powerful metaphor: "I am the vine, you are the branches." This image teaches us that transformation is not about striving but about staying connected to Christ. Today, let's explore three key truths about how abiding in Christ leads to transformation.

This Transformation Begins with Connection

"Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me." (John 15:4)

The first step in transformation is staying connected to Jesus. A branch does not produce fruit on its own it needs the life-giving nourishment of the vine. In the same way, we cannot grow spiritually by our own efforts. We need Jesus.

Therefore, you might ask... What does it mean to abide in Jesus? When Jesus says, "Abide in me, and I will abide in you" (John 15:4), He is inviting us into a deep, ongoing, life-giving relationship with Him. To **abide** means to remain, dwell, and stay connected—it is not a temporary or occasional connection but a constant, daily dependence on Him. Abiding in Christ is not just about believing in Him; it is about living in Him, drawing our strength, purpose, and identity from Him. Simply said....

- It means spending time in prayer and Scripture.
- It means seeking His presence daily.
- It means trusting Him in every season of life.

When we are connected to Jesus, His life flows into us, changing us from the inside out.

But every transformation requires pruning, to put it simply. "Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit." (John 15:2)

Transformation is not always comfortable. God sometimes prunes us, removing things that hinder our growth. This might be bad habits, unhealthy relationships, or attitudes that don't reflect Christ. For some, maybe many, this might not be easy. Change isn't good. In God's eyes it is....because, it helps us grow in faith and character. It removes distractions that pull us away from Him. And in the end it makes us more fruitful in His kingdom.

Pruning can be painful, but it is always for our good. When God removes something, it is to make room for something better. And what that is Well transformation produces fruit. "Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing." (John 15:5)

The goal of transformation is fruitfulness, not just for ourselves, but for the world around us. When we abide in Christ, we begin to reflect His character: Thing such as, love, joy, and peace (Galatians 5:22-23). A heart for serving others. And a deepened faith that sustains us through trials.

The more we stay connected to Christ, the more His life shines through us. People will see the change in us and be drawn to Him.

So how does this intertwine with our Lenten journey?

Lent is a season of reflection, repentance, and renewal—a time when we intentionally draw closer to Christ. Just as Jesus calls us to *abide* in Him, Lent invites us to remain in His presence, to let go of what holds us back, and to allow God's transforming work within us.

When we abide in Christ during this sacred season, we surrender to His pruning...letting go of sin, distractions, and anything that hinders our growth. We make space for Him to nourish us, to renew our minds and hearts, and to shape us into His likeness.

Lent is not just about giving something up; it is about growing deeper in Christ. It is about walking the road of transformation, trusting that as we remain in Him, He will make us fruitful for His glory.

So let us continue this Lenten journey, not by striving in our own strength, but by staying connected to the true Vine. Abide in Christ, and watch how He transforms your life.
