SCRIPTURE READING: John 4:5-42

John 4:5-42

New International Version

⁵ So he came to a town in Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of ground Jacob had given to his son Joseph. ⁶ Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired as he was from the journey, sat down by the well. It was about noon.

⁷ When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Will you give me a drink?" ⁸ (His disciples had gone into the town to buy food.)

⁹ The Samaritan woman said to him, "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?" (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans. [a])

¹⁰ Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

¹¹ "Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? ¹² Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his livestock?"

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¹³ Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, ¹⁴ but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

¹⁵ The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water."

¹⁶He told her, "Go, call your husband and come back."

¹⁷ "I have no husband," she replied.

Jesus said to her, "You are right when you say you have no husband. ¹⁸ The fact is, you have had five husbands, and the man you now have is not your husband. What you have just said is quite true." ¹⁹ "Sir," the woman said, "I can see that you are a prophet. ²⁰ Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem."

²¹ "Woman," Jesus replied, "believe me, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. ²² You Samaritans worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. ²³ Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. ²⁴ God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in the Spirit and in truth."

²⁵ The woman said, "I know that Messiah" (called Christ) "is coming. When he comes, he will explain everything to us."

²⁶ Then Jesus declared, "I, the one speaking to you—I am he."

The Disciples Rejoin Jesus

²⁷ Just then his disciples returned and were surprised to find him talking with a woman. But no one asked, "What do you want?" or "Why are you talking with her?"

²⁸ Then, leaving her water jar, the woman went back to the town and said to the people, ²⁹ "Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Messiah?" ³⁰ They came out of the town and made their way toward him.

³¹ Meanwhile his disciples urged him, "Rabbi, eat something."

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³² But he said to them, "I have food to eat that you know nothing about." ³³ Then his disciples said to each other, "Could someone have brought him food?"

³⁴ "My food," said Jesus, "is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work. ³⁵ Don't you have a saying, 'It's still four months until harvest'? I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest. ³⁶ Even now the one who reaps draws a wage and harvests a crop for eternal life, so that the sower and the reaper may be glad together. ³⁷ Thus the saying 'One sows and another reaps' is true. ³⁸ I sent you to reap what you have not worked for. Others have done the hard work, and you have reaped the benefits of their labor."

Many Samaritans Believe

³⁹ Many of the Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman's testimony, "He told me everything I ever did." ⁴⁰ So when the Samaritans came to him, they urged him to stay with them, and he stayed two days. ⁴¹ And because of his words many more became believers.

⁴² They said to the woman, "We no longer believe just because of what you said; now we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this man really is the Savior of the world."

MESSAGE: "The Path of Living Water"

John 4:5-42

Introduction: The Thirst We All Carry

Have you ever been truly thirsty? I mean the kind of thirst that makes your throat dry, your lips crack, and your body weak. When we are that thirsty, water becomes the most precious thing in the world.

But there is another kind of thirst—one that goes beyond the physical. It is the thirst of the soul, the longing for something more, the deep desire for purpose, for love, for belonging. This is the thirst that Jesus speaks of in His encounter with the Samaritan woman at the well. It is the thirst that only the Living Water can satisfy.

Jesus arrives at a well in Samaria, tired from His journey, and He sits down to rest. A woman comes to draw water, at noon, the hottest part of the day, when no one else would be there. She comes alone, possibly to avoid the whispers and judgment of others.

And then something unexpected happens: Jesus speaks to her. "Give me a drink," He says.

This surprises her. First, because Jesus, a Jew, is speaking to her, a Samaritan, a people despised by the Jews. Second, because He is a man speaking to a woman in public, breaking cultural norms.

But Jesus isn't just asking for a drink; He is offering something far greater. "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water." (John 4:10)

The woman is confused. She sees only the physical, she points out that Jesus has no bucket to draw water. But Jesus speaks of something deeper. The water from the well will quench thirst only for a moment. The Living Water He offers brings eternal life.

What Is This Living Water?

When Jesus speaks of Living Water, He is talking about:

- 1. The gift of salvation A life filled with God's grace, forgiveness, and transformation.
- 2. The presence of the Holy Spirit The wellspring of God within us, refreshing, renewing, and guiding us.
- 3. A life of purpose and joy No longer seeking temporary fulfillment, but drawing from the deep well of God's love.

The woman, though skeptical at first, longs for this water. "Sir, give me this water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water." (John 4:15)

But before she can receive this gift, Jesus gently confronts her reality. He tells her to bring her husband. She responds, "I have no husband." And Jesus, knowing her story, reveals that she has had five husbands and is now living with someone who is not her husband.

• The Samaritan woman had tried to fill her life with relationships, but they never truly satisfied.

This isn't about shame ... it's about truth. Jesus meets her where she is but doesn't leave her there. He invites her into something new.

Like the Samaritan woman, we often come to God carrying burdens, broken relationships, past mistakes, regrets, and disappointments. We try to quench our thirst with things that don't satisfy: success, approval, possessions, distractions. But Jesus invites us to lay all of it down and receive the Living Water that truly satisfies.

Many today look to success, money, or pleasure for fulfillment, but only Jesus provides lasting peace.

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As their conversation continues, the woman begins to see that Jesus is not just any man He is the Messiah, the one who knows her fully and still loves her completely.

And what does she do? She leaves her water jar and runs back to town to tell others. The very people she may have been avoiding, she now seeks out, saying:

"Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Messiah?" (John 4:29)

Her life is transformed, and she becomes one of the first evangelists sharing the good news of Jesus with others. Because of her testimony, many Samaritans come to believe.

This story, which I love, has such a powerful message even for us today. This story is one that teaches us that:

- 1. Jesus meets us where we are No matter our past, our struggles, or our failures, He comes to us with love and grace.
- 2. He offers us something greater A new life, a transformed heart, and the presence of the Holy Spirit within us.

We are called to share this gift – When we truly encounter Jesus, we cannot keep it to ourselves. Like the Samaritan woman, we are called to go and tell others about the One who has changed our lives.

For this third Sunday of Lent, this story is a reminder to us all that Jesus still offers this Living Water.

So, I ask myself and all of you Are you thirsty for something more? Are you carrying burdens that leave you empty? Are you searching for purpose, hope, and love?

Come to Jesus. Drink deeply of His grace. And then, go and share this water with a thirsty world.
