People: But God gives us grace, even when we're stuck in the starting spot.

Leader: We may roll the dice, pick the wrong card, or land on "Go to Jail"—

People: But God is always ready with a second chance, a new turn, and unshakable love.

Leader: So whether we're winning, losing, or just trying to stay in the game—

People: We trust in the One who's with us every step of the way. **All:** God, help us play with faith, live with joy, and love like Jesus—all the way to the finish line!

MESSAGE AND SCRIPTURE VERSES: "Board Games & Bible Truths"

Philippians 3:14 "I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus."

Today we are diving into something a little different. We're looking for holy wisdom in an unexpected place: our favorite board games! Yes, believe it or not, games like Monopoly, Jenga, Uno, and Sorry! have something to teach us about life, faith, and following Jesus. Let's roll the dice, shuffle the cards, and see what lessons God might reveal today. Our first game, Monopoly, teaches us about Stewardship

Scripture: Luke 16:10 – "Whoever is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much."

Monopoly is all about properties, houses, hotels, and of course, money. Every decision in the game can either help you win or leave you bankrupt. But let's be honest: it also teaches us what not to do with our resources. It can become a lesson in greed, selfishness, and hoarding. But the Gospel calls us to something different. God has entrusted us with so much: our time, money, talents, and opportunities. And He calls us to use them wisely, generously, and joyfully. Stewardship isn't about how much you have; it's about how you use what you have. In Monopoly, if you hoard everything, others suffer. In the Kingdom of God, generosity builds community. God calls us to be faithful in the little things, and He promises to do great things through them. Our second game Jenga, teaches us about trust and a firm foundation. *Scripture:* Matthew 7:24–27 – The wise build their house on the rock.

Jenga is a game of balance. Every piece matters. Take one wrong block, and the whole tower crashes. Life is a lot like that. If we build our lives on shaky foundations, our ego, ambition, or the opinions of others, everything can come crashing down.

But Jesus tells us to build our lives on Him. He is our rock, our firm foundation. When we live with faith and trust in God, our spiritual structure holds strong, even when life gets wobbly. Like a good Jenga player, we must be thoughtful, intentional, and trust in the support underneath us.

Our Third game is Uno. It teaches us about forgiveness and fresh starts. *Scripture:* Colossians 3:13 – "Forgive as the Lord forgave you." If you've ever played Uno, you know the chaos of a Draw 4 card. You think you're about to win, and someone zaps you. Maybe you've been the one to drop that card with a little too much joy. But eventually, everyone moves on and laughs about it.

Forgiveness is like that. We hurt each other. We get hurt. But holding onto it only slows down the game. Jesus doesn't hold grudges, and we shouldn't either. Forgiveness gives us a fresh start, a new card, and a better way to move forward.

Our last game is Sorry! It teaches us about repentance and grace

Scripture: 1 John 1:9 – "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us..."

Sorry! is a game of bold moves and apologetic smiles. You knock someone off the board and say, "Sorry!" But it's often not sincere. In life, though, real "sorry" matters.

True repentance means recognizing our mistakes and turning around. It means asking for forgiveness with humility and receiving grace with gratitude. The good news is that God always lets us back in the game. He doesn't keep score the way we do. When we confess, He forgives. Grace is more than a do-over; it's an invitation to keep growing. And so, we come to the scripture from Philippians 3:14 "I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus."

All games have a goal: reach the finish line, stack the tower, collect the most. But in faith, our goal is not to win over others, it's to become

more like Christ. Life is full of ups and downs, skipped turns, and restarts. But we press on.

When you fall behind, when you mess up, when someone else seems to be winning ... God is still with you. And He reminds you: the journey is just as important as the destination. So, we keep going, with hope, joy, and grace.

Remember ... Faith isn't about playing perfectly; it's about playing with purpose. Steward what you have. Build on the Rock. Forgive and be forgiven. Say you're sorry and mean it. And always keep your eyes on the goal.

Let God teach you, even through games. And may you live your faith like it matter, because it does.

We pray for leaders in our communities, churches, and world, that they may seek wisdom and justice.

And now we bring forward those we have named and those we name silently in our hearts (name those that have been named and pause). May your healing hand, your peace and you surround love surround all who call upon you gracious God.

Lord, keep us moving forward, not for trophies or scoreboards, but for love's sake. Help us to press on together with courage and joy, knowing that your Spirit cheers us on every step of the way.
