# The Parable of the Great Banquet

- <sup>15</sup> When one of those at the table with him heard this, he said to Jesus, "Blessed is the one who will eat at the feast in the kingdom of God." <sup>16</sup> Jesus replied: "A certain man was preparing a great banquet and invited many guests. <sup>17</sup> At the time of the banquet he sent his servant to tell those who had been invited, 'Come, for everything is now ready.' <sup>18</sup> "But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said, 'I have just bought a field, and I must go and see it. Please excuse me.'
- <sup>19</sup> "Another said, 'I have just bought five yoke of oxen, and I'm on my way to try them out. Please excuse me.'
- <sup>20</sup> "Still another said, 'I just got married, so I can't come.'
- <sup>21</sup> "The servant came back and reported this to his master. Then the owner of the house became angry and ordered his servant, 'Go out quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind and the lame.'
- <sup>22</sup> "Sir,' the servant said, 'what you ordered has been done, but there is still room.'
- <sup>23</sup> "Then the master told his servant, 'Go out to the roads and country lanes and compel them to come in, so that my house will be full. <sup>24</sup> I tell you, not one of those who were invited will get a taste of my banquet."

#### **MESSAGE:** Come to the Table

Not long ago, I was at a family gathering where the dining table was stretched out as far as it could go, leaves added, extra chairs pulled in from the living room, and still we were squeezing in. You know that feeling, elbows bumping, passing the bread around, children running in and out. It was chaotic, but it was also beautiful.

What made that meal special wasn't just the food. It was the welcome. Everyone had a place, even the ones who arrived late, even the ones who hadn't RSVP'd, even the ones who were a little hard to get along with. There was room for all of us.

Jesus tells a story in Luke about a banquet where everyone is invited. Some of the "expected guests" make excuses, so the host throws the doors wide open: the poor, the crippled, the blind, the lame ... all those usually left out are given a seat of honor. The story reminds us: God's table is bigger than we can imagine, and God's invitation is for everyone.

On World Wide Communion Sunday, this truth shines even brighter. Today, as we gather here, millions of Christians are gathering too... in tiny chapels and grand cathedrals, in homes and in open fields, in places of peace and in places of conflict. Bread is being broken. Cups are being lifted. And all of us, different as we may be, are part of one family of faith.

When we say "all are welcome," we mean the child with wide-eyed wonder and the elder who has walked with Christ for many years. We mean those who are filled with joy and those who carry heavy burdens. We mean the stranger and the friend, the seeker and the faithful. At Christ's table, there are no outsiders.

This meal reminds us of who we are and whose we are. We are God's beloved children, bound together in Christ across every border and every difference. And we are sent out from this table to live that welcome in our daily lives—to become people of hospitality, peace, and grace in a world that longs for unity.

So, come to the table. Come with your doubts and your faith, your hopes and your fears. Come hungry, come thirsty, come just as you are. For here, at Christ's table, all are welcome.

Leader: Around the world today, bread is broken and cups are lifted.

In villages and cities, in grand cathedrals and simple homes,

God's people gather at this same feast.

**People:** We come, for all are welcome here.

Leader: Come with your doubts and your faith, your joys and your

sorrows, your hopes and your fears.

**People:** We come, for all are welcome here.

**Leader:** Come, not because you must, but because you may. Come, not because you are strong, but because you are weak. Come, not because of any goodness of your own, but because of God's grace.

**People:** We come, for all are welcome here.

Leader: So let us gather as God's beloved children. At Christ's table,

there is a place for you, and there is a place for all.

All Together: We come to the table of grace. We come to the table of

love. We come, for all are welcome here.

**Leader:** This table is not ours, but Christ's. It is made ready for those who love him and for those who want to love him more. So come, you who have much faith and you who would like to have more; you who have been here often, and you who have not been for a long time; you who have tried to follow, and you who have failed. Come, not because it is I who invite you— it is our Lord. It is Christ's will that those who love him should meet him here.

**People:** Today we remember we are not alone at this table. Around the world, in every language, with bread baked in every culture, with wine or juice poured in every land, the people of God gather at Christ's feast. We join this holy meal with Christians everywhere—one Body, one Spirit, one faith, one hope.

#### GREAT THANKSGIVING
