LITANY: “Entering the Wilderness”

Leader: The season of Lent begins.

People: We step into the wilderness with Jesus.

Leader: In the wilderness, distractions fall away.

People: We come seeking what is true.

Leader: In the wilderness, we face temptation and uncertainty.

People: We trust that God walks beside us.

Leader: When we are tempted to rely only on ourselves...

People: Remind us that we live by every word that comes from God.

Leader: When we are tempted to seek power or recognition...

People: Teach us the quiet strength of humility.

Leader: When we are tempted to doubt God's presence...

People: Anchor us in your faithful love.

Leader: This season is not about despair...

People: It is about drawing closer to Christ.

Leader: The wilderness is not empty.

People: God is there.

Leader: The journey is not easy.

People: But it is holy.

All: Lead us, O God, through these forty days, that we may emerge renewed, strengthened in faith, and ready to follow Jesus more closely.

SCRIPTURE READING: Luke 4:1–13

Jesus Is Tested in the Wilderness

4 Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness,² where for forty days he was tempted^[a] by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them he was hungry.

3 The devil said to him, “If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread.”

4 Jesus answered, “It is written: ‘Man shall not live on bread alone.’^[b]”

5 The devil led him up to a high place and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. **6** And he said to him, “I will give you all their authority and splendor; it has been given to me, and I can give it to anyone I want to. **7** If you worship me, it will all be yours.”

8 Jesus answered, “It is written: ‘Worship the Lord your God and serve him only.’^[c]”

9 The devil led him to Jerusalem and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. “If you are the Son of God,” he said, “throw yourself down from here. **10** For it is written:

“He will command his angels concerning you to guard you carefully;

11 they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone.”^[d]

12 Jesus answered, “It is said: ‘Do not put the Lord your God to the test.’^[e]”

13 When the devil had finished all this tempting, he left him until an opportune time.

MESSAGE: “The Pressure to Prove Ourselves”

The wilderness is not just sand and stones. It is the place where we feel exposed. It is the place where we feel pressure. It is the place where our strength feels thin. Luke tells us that Jesus was “full of the Spirit” and then He was led into the wilderness. Notice that. He wasn’t led there because He failed. He wasn’t led there because He sinned. He was led there because He was human. Because wilderness comes to all of us. Temptation is often misunderstood. We think temptation means dramatic wrongdoing. But often temptation is quieter.

It sounds like this:

“Prove yourself.”

“Take control.”

“Make it easier.”

“Cut the corner.”

“Don’t let them see you struggle.”

“Handle it yourself.”

In our communities, temptation can sound like:

- Don’t admit you’re tired.
- Don’t talk about the diagnosis.
- Don’t say the farm/ business isn’t doing well.
- Don’t let anyone see doubt.

The first temptation Jesus faces is about bread. He’s hungry. He’s human. He’s empty.

“If you are the Son of God, turn this stone into bread.” In other words: Prove it. Use your power. Take control. But Jesus refuses to define Himself by performance. He doesn’t prove Himself. He trusts God.

The second temptation? Power. Recognition. Control. The third? Protection from pain. Each one whispers: Take the shortcut. Avoid the hard road. Prove who you are. But Jesus does something remarkable.

He stands firm, not because He is superhuman, but because He is rooted.
Temptation often strikes when we are:

- Tired
- Hungry (for affirmation)
- Lonely
- Uncertain

Sound familiar? Lent invites us to notice: What tempts us?

What pressures us? What are we trying to prove?

Maybe we're tempted to:

- Overwork
- Appear stronger than we are
- Avoid difficult conversations
- Distract ourselves from grief
- Carry burdens silently

Temptation is not weakness. It is human. Even Jesus faced it. And notice something else ... He did not face it alone. "The Spirit led Him." And angels later attended Him. He was held. And so are we. The wilderness is not punishment. It is preparation. The pressure to prove ourselves is heavy. The need to appear fine is heavy. The belief that we must carry everything ourselves is heavy. And that is why we have this backpack. Today we placed one stone inside: Temptation.

We name it. We don't hide it. And we remember: Christ has walked the wilderness before us. You do not have to prove your worth.

You do not have to carry every burden alone. You do not have to win every battle quietly. The One who resisted the wilderness walks beside you still. Amen.

Be near to those who feel alone in their struggle. Teach us that asking for help is not weakness. Teach us that trust is stronger than control. Teach us that Your grace is enough. We pray in the name of Christ, who faced the wilderness and overcame. Amen.

and thy rich promises in me fulfil. **[Refrain]**

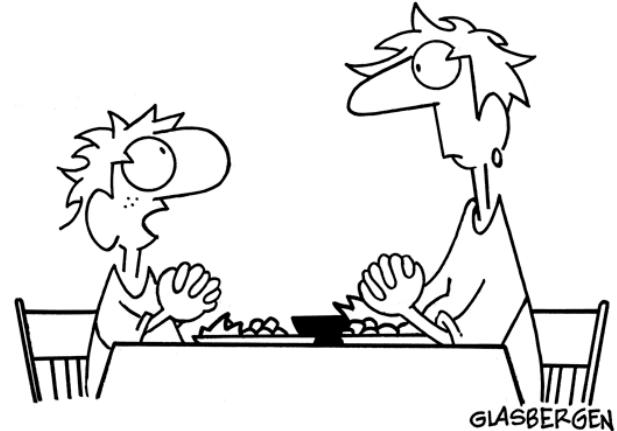
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BENEDICTION
