### CHILDREN'S TIME: "Name Tags"

Bring simple paper name tags.

Ask: "Who here has ever worn a name tag? Why do we wear them?"

Explain: "Sometimes we forget who we truly are. God gives us a special name —*Beloved*. No matter how the day goes, God says, 'You are mine.'"

Give each child a tag: write **Beloved** underneath their name.  
Bless them and send them off.

## CHILDREN'S VIDEO

### LITANY FOR REAFFIRMING BAPTISM

**Leader:** We come to the water, remembering a story older than we are, a story of grace, calling, and new beginnings.

**People:** We remember our baptism, and give thanks.

**Leader:** When Jesus stepped into the Jordan, God's voice declared, "*You are my beloved.*"

**People:** That same promise is spoken to us: We belong to God.

**Leader:** When fear whispers that we are not enough...

**People:** God says, "*You are mine.*"

**Leader:** When we forget our purpose ...

**People:** God calls us back to the path of love.

**All:** We believe in God, who calls us by name and never lets us go.  
We believe in Jesus Christ, who entered the waters with us

and showed us that God's love has no limits. We believe in the Holy Spirit, who reminds us, day by day: "You are beloved. Walk in my grace." We are God's children, claimed, forgiven, and sent to live with hope. Thanks be to God. Amen.

### Isaiah 43:1-3

#### Israel's Only Saviour

**43** But now, this is what the LORD says—

he who created you, Jacob,  
he who formed you, Israel:

"Do not fear, for I have redeemed you;

I have summoned you by name; you are mine.

<sup>2</sup> When you pass through the waters,

I will be with you;

and when you pass through the rivers,

they will not sweep over you.

When you walk through the fire,

you will not be burned;

the flames will not set you ablaze.

<sup>3</sup> For I am the LORD your God,

the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour;

### Mark 1:1-11

#### John the Baptist Prepares the Way

**1** The beginning of the good news about Jesus the Messiah,<sup>[a]</sup> the Son of God,<sup>[b]</sup> <sup>2</sup> as it is written in Isaiah the prophet:

"I will send my messenger ahead of you,  
who will prepare your way"<sup>[c]</sup>—

<sup>3</sup> “a voice of one calling in the wilderness,  
 ‘Prepare the way for the Lord,  
 make straight paths for him.’”<sup>[d]</sup>

<sup>4</sup> And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. <sup>5</sup> The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River. <sup>6</sup> John wore clothing made of camel’s hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. <sup>7</sup> And this was his message: “After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. <sup>8</sup> I baptize you with<sup>[e]</sup> water, but he will baptize you with<sup>[f]</sup> the Holy Spirit.”

### **The Baptism and Testing of Jesus**

<sup>9</sup> At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. <sup>10</sup> Just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. <sup>11</sup> And a voice came from heaven: “You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased.”

### **MESSAGE: “Remembering Who You Are”**

There’s something powerful about hearing your name spoken with love. Maybe you remember a teacher who believed in you. Or a grandparent who said your name with warmth. Or a friend who looked at you and said, “You matter.” Those simple words can steady us when life becomes noisy or uncertain. Today we hear God speak *those* kinds of words, not only to Jesus but to us.

Jesus is now a grown man ... when Jesus came to the Jordan River, there was no choir, no stained-glass window, no organ prelude. Just water. Mud at the edges. People waiting in line. It looked ordinary ... John the Baptist was baptising people in God’s name. Jesus steps into that ordinary river because that is where God meets us. In the ordinary.....

Not only on the mountaintop. Not only in the sanctuary. But right in the middle of everyday life.

And as Jesus rises from the water, the heavens open and a voice says: “You are my Son, the Beloved. With you I am well pleased.”

That sentence is not just an announcement about Jesus, it is a declaration about God’s heart. Before Jesus preaches a sermon,

before He heals, before miracles, before sacrifice, God says ... You are loved. You are mine. I delight in you. The order matters. Jesus does not work *for* love, He works *out of* love. And baptism reminds us of that same truth. We live in a world that constantly says: “You are what you produce.” “You are how successful you are.” “You are the image you present.” But baptism says: NO! Each of You are God’s beloved ... first, last, and always. Of course, we don’t always feel beloved. There are days when worries wake us in the middle of the night. There are seasons when grief lingers. There are struggles no one else sees. And in those moments, other voices try to define us: “You’re falling behind.” “You’re not good enough.” “Other people have it more together.” But those voices do not have the final say. When we reaffirm baptism, we are not pretending life is easy, we are remembering that life is held. Held by God’s promise: “When you pass through the waters, I will be with you.”

(Isaiah 43:2)

I would like to share with you that Baptism isn’t a one-time event. Some people believe that once the water dries. The day moves on. Many people think that well that done, I am good ... but not so. As Christians, we return again and again to the font, not to redo the past but to remember the truth, that Baptism means... We don’t face tomorrow alone.

We don’t carry burdens without help. We don’t have to prove our worth. We belong to God. And because we belong to God, we are sent... like Jesus was sent ... sent into classrooms, retirement homes, grocery stores, hospitals, kitchens, committee meetings, workplaces, and neighbourhoods to live as people who carry God’s love into the world. So today, as you see the water, hear these words again ...

**“You are my beloved child. With you I am well pleased.”**

Remember you are God’s beloved child ... Not because you are perfect. Not because you never fall. But because God has chosen to claim you, to love you, and to walk beside you through every day of your life. May that promise steady us, comfort us, and give us courage, and may others begin to hear it through us, too.
