One: Not the stressful waiting, not the "where-did-I-hide-the-tape?" waiting, that is hopeful, joy-filled kind that reminds us something wonderful is coming.

All: We gather to breathe deeply, open our hearts, and prepare room for Christ.

One: As lights twinkle, lists grow, and calendars fill... God whispers, "Slow down. I'm already here."

All: We come to worship with expectation, with laughter, with hope, and with open hands.

One: Come, people of God, the journey to Bethlehem begins!

All: Thanks be to God!

ADVENT HYMN: #29 Hark the Glad Sound

OPENING PRAYER

ADVENT CANDLE LIGHTING: HOPE

Reader 1: Today we light the first candle of Advent: the Candle of Hope. In a world that often asks too much and moves too fast, this candle reminds us that hope doesn't rush. Hope grows gently, one flicker at a time. As we begin our Advent journey, may this small flame warm our hearts and remind us that Christ is coming, and that is very good news.

Reader 2: This is a promise that God meets us in the ordinary days, in the quiet moments, and even in the messy ones.

Reader 1: Today we light the Candle of Hope. Not the hope that comes from perfect plans or perfect holidays, but the hope that comes from God's steady, unfailing presence.

Reader 2: As this candle burns, may it slow our hearts, lift our spirits, and remind us that God is already at work in our waiting. We light this candle with hope, gentle hope, steady hope, the hope that leads us toward the joy of Christmas.

(The first advent Candle is lit the candle.)

All: Thanks be to God. Amen.

CHILDREN' VIDEO

ADVENT LITANY: "Preparing Our Hearts, Not Our To-Do Lists"

Voice 1: Today we begin Advent, the season of waiting, watching, and getting ready.

Voice 2: But let's be honest... most of us arrived this morning thinking, "I'm *already* behind on Christmas!"

Voice 1: Gifts, lists, baking, cleaning, decorating...

Voice 2: And that's just the first page!

Voice 1: But Advent invites us into a different kind of preparation, you know, not a frantic one, but a faithful one.

Leader: We prepare our hearts, not just our homes.

Voice 2: I know, Advent says, "Slow down. Take a breath. I am with you."

All: We breathe in God's peace. We breathe out the holiday stress.

Voice 1: So let's, not be in a rush... not become overwhelmed with stress...

But with hope, peace, joy, and love.

Voice 2: And guess what ... *none* of those require online shopping or going to the Mall.

Leader: We wait with hope. We welcome Christ with joy.

Voice 1: You know what, This season isn't about being perfect.

Voice 2: Yes! It's about being present.

Voice 1: Present to God's promise.

Voice 2: And, present to each other.

Leader: Come, Lord Jesus. We are making room for You.

Voice 1: So let's begin this Advent journey gently.

Voice 2: With open hands...

Voice 1: Open hearts...

Voice 2: And a readiness to notice God in small, ordinary moments.

Leader: We light the candles. We lift our spirits.

We welcome the Holy One, born in wonder.

Come, Lord Jesus, our hearts are ready.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Isaiah 40:1-5 Comfort for God's People

40 Comfort, comfort my people, says your God.

² Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her hard service has been completed,

that her sin has been paid for,

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that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

- ³ A voice of one calling:
- "In the wilderness prepare the way for the LORD^[a];

make straight in the desert

a highway for our God. [b]

⁴ Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low;

the rough ground shall become level,

the rugged places a plain.

⁵ And the glory of the LORD will be revealed, and all people will see it together.

For the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

This passage emphasizes comfort and hope for the people of Israel, sign aling the end of their suffering and the coming of God's glory.

Luke 1:26-38

The Birth of Jesus Foretold

²⁶ In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, ²⁷ to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you."

²⁹ Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. ³⁰ But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. ³¹ You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, ³³ and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end."

³⁴ "How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?"
³⁵ The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called^[a] the Son of God. ³⁶ Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be unable

to conceive is in her sixth month. ³⁷ For no word from God will ever fail."

³⁸ "I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled." Then the angel left her.

MESSAGE: "Preparing for Christmas Without Losing Our Minds" It's Advent again—the season when Christmas preparation begins. And for many of us... so does the mild panic. We start making lists. Then we make lists for our lists. We find the Christmas lights, plug them in—and half of them don't work, even though they worked perfectly when we put them away. This is the season where every commercial tells us we must do more, buy more, cook more, clean more, and somehow also "relax and enjoy it all." No wonder people come to church looking tired! But Advent... Advent is God's gentle reminder that preparing for Christmas was never meant to be stressful. Look at Mary. Was she "ready"? Of course not. But she was open. Look at the shepherds—they were working the night shift. Not exactly rested and organized! But they were willing to look up. Look at the Wise Men—their journey took years, and they didn't rush. They followed the light, step by step. Not one person in the Christmas story had everything under control. Not one person had a colour-coded schedule, matching stockings, or perfectly wrapped gifts. But each one carried hope. And that was enough. So maybe this year, as we begin the journey to Bethlehem, our preparation can look a little different. Maybe we can slow down just enough to notice small joys—the glow of a candle, a kind word from a neighbour, the laughter of a child, the music that fills the sanctuary. Maybe we can set aside perfection and choose presence. Maybe we can remember that we don't have to get Christmas "right." We only have to make room for Christ. So here's your Advent practice for the week—simple and doable:

Every day, pause for 20 seconds and whisper:

"There is room for hope here."

In your kitchen. In your car. In your worries. In your waiting. There is room for hope. Because Christ is coming, and nothing, absolutely nothing, can take away the joy of that promise. Amen.
