SCRIPTURE READING

John 1:35-42

John's Disciples Follow Jesus

³⁵ The next day John was there again with two of his disciples. ³⁶ When he saw Jesus passing by, he said, "Look, the Lamb of God!"

³⁷ When the two disciples heard him say this, they followed Jesus. ³⁸ Turning around, Jesus saw them following and asked, "What do you want?"

They said, "Rabbi" (which means "Teacher"), "where are you staying?"

³⁹ "Come," he replied, "and you will see."

So they went and saw where he was staying, and they spent that day with him. It was about four in the afternoon.

⁴⁰ Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, was one of the two who heard what John had said and who had followed Jesus. ⁴¹ The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and tell him, "We have found the Messiah" (that is, the Christ). ⁴² And he brought him to Jesus.

Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You will be called Cephas" (which, when translated, is Peter^[a]).

MESSAGE: Following Jesus Isn't as Easy as It Used to Be

When Jesus called his first disciples, life was simpler, not easier, but simpler. They didn't have smartphones buzzing every few minutes.

They didn't have overflowing calendars, endless emails, CNN blasting news 24/7, or a world that never stops talking.

As simple as this statement...Jesus walked by. He spoke. They followed. Today, following Jesus feels harder, not because Jesus asks more, but because everything else asks for us too. We are pulled in a hundred directions: work, family, appointments, expectations, worries about the world. Think of it this way, Faith becomes one voice among many, instead of the guiding one. And yet, notice how Jesus calls in John's Gospel. He doesn't give a speech. He doesn't demand commitment upfront. He simply asks, "*What are you looking for?*" And then he invites them: "*Come and see.*" That invitation stands the

test of time. Jesus does not say, “Come when your life is sorted out.” “Come when you have more time.” “Come when your faith is stronger.” He says, “*Come and see.*” Following Jesus isn’t as easy as it used to be ... not because Jesus has changed, but because our world has. Life is busier, louder, and more demanding. We are pulled in many directions by schedules, responsibilities, worries, and the constant noise around us. We want to care, but sometimes feel overwhelmed by how much suffering we see. We long to be kind, yet find it harder in a world quick to judge and divide. And still, in the middle of uncertainty and ordinary days, Jesus does not shout or rush us. He simply comes alongside us and gently says, “*Come and see.*” Following Jesus today may not mean leaving everything behind—but choosing, again and again, to walk with him right where we are. The call is quieter now, we have to listen closer to hear it, but it is no less real. And just like Andrew did, when we take even one small step toward Jesus, we find ourselves inviting others along the way. Faith today isn’t about dropping everything and walking down a road, it’s about choosing, again and again, to walk with Christ wherever we already are.
