and kings to the brightness of your dawn.

Matthew 2:1-12

The Magi Visit the Messiah

2 After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi^[a] from the east came to Jerusalem **2** and asked, “Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him.”

3 When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. **4** When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born. **5** “In Bethlehem in Judea,” they replied, “for this is what the prophet has written:

6 “‘But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,
are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;
for out of you will come a ruler
who will shepherd my people Israel.’^[b]”

7 Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. **8** He sent them to Bethlehem and said, “Go and search carefully for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him.”

9 After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. **10** When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. **11** On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. **12** And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.

MESSAGE: “A New Beginning ... Following the Star”

New Years always come wrapped in words like fresh start, resolutions, plans, dreams. We write lists, set goals, clear calendars, and tell ourselves: “This year will be different.”

And then ... somewhere between mid-January and reality, life happens. Habits creep back. Plans shift. Resolutions fade.

But Scripture shows us that God's new beginnings don't depend on our perfection, they depend on our willingness to follow.

And so, we meet the Magi. They weren't part of Israel. They weren't prophets or priests. They were scientists, scholars, travelers, seekers.

They saw a light in the sky...and they chose to move. They did not know exactly where God was leading. They did not have a map. They had only a star, and a sense that God was doing something new.

A new king. A new story. A new hope entering the world. They were intrigued, and they followed...

Put it this way, new beginnings often start with a nudge, not a blueprint
The Magi were not told, “Go to Bethlehem, third house on the left, ask for Mary.”

They were simply guided:

“Look toward the light. Keep going.”

Sometimes we hesitate to begin new things because we want certainty first:

- “What if I fail?”
- “What if I don’t know enough?”
- “What if I’m not ready?”

But God’s invitations often sound more like:

“Take one step. Trust Me for the next one.”

New beginnings rarely arrive all wrapped and labeled. They unfold as we move toward God.

And when the Magi finally arrived, they didn’t just admire the baby, they opened their treasures.

Each gift tells us something about Jesus...

and about what we might offer as this new year begins.

Gold honored Jesus as King.

It reminds us that faith is more than a Sunday activity, it shapes our choices, priorities, and relationships. A new year invites us to ask:

Where might Jesus need to be first again in my life?

Frankincense symbolized prayer and worship.

In a noisy world, God invites us to pause, breathe, and remember His presence in our ordinary days. Even small moments of prayer can re-center our hearts.

Myrrh pointed toward the suffering Jesus would one day face.

It tells us that God does not avoid our struggles, God enters them.

Whatever this year holds, we are not alone. Christ walks with us through both joy and sorrow.

And then the Magi went home “by another road”

After meeting Jesus, they could not return the same way.

Herod’s darkness still lurked, but they had encountered Light. When Christ becomes real, even familiar roads change.

Maybe this year God is nudging us to go by another road:

- another way of responding to conflict,
- another way of giving,
- another way of seeing those on the margins,
- another way of trusting instead of worrying.

New beginnings are rarely about adding more tasks.

They are often about learning to walk differently in life, more graciously, more courageously, more lovingly.

But what Jesus most desires is not wrapped in gold or paper.

He desires hearts that say: “Here I am, Lord, use me.”

In a world hungry for hope, we become gifts when we:

- speak kindness,
- practice forgiveness,
- support the lonely,
- give generously,
- listen deeply,
- carry Christ’s light into ordinary places.

The Magi did not just *see* the star ... they followed it.

They didn’t just admire the child ... they worshipped Him.

And then they quietly returned to their lives, changed... lighter...

carriers of a story that would shape the world. As we step into this new year: May we look for God’s star, even if it appears faint at first.

May we trust God enough to take the next step, even if we don’t yet see the whole road. May we offer our own gifts. Our time, compassion, talents, prayers, generosity. And like the Magi, may we meet Christ in the unexpected place...and go forward, by another road, with renewed hope, ready for God’s new beginning.

Amen.
