MESSAGE: "Living Forward in Faith"

Have you ever wondered why our windshields are larger than our rearview mirrors. Well maybe it's because

Where we are going is more important than where we have been. Yet in life, we often find ourselves looking behind us. You know things like ... replaying old mistakes, dwelling on what we've lost, or longing for what used to be. The people of Israel felt that way when the prophet Jeremiah wrote to them. They had been taken into exile, away from their homes, their routines, their comfort. They couldn't imagine a hopeful future. But into that moment, God speaks these words:

"For I know the plans I have for you... plans to give you a future with hope." It's important to notice: God didn't say, "I might have plans," or "I'm thinking about it." God says, "I know the plans I have for you." Our future does not depend on our strength, it rests on God's certainty. Don't think that God's hope is wishful thinking, it is a promise.

Human hope is often based on circumstance: "I hope the weather is nice" or "I hope this works out."

But God's hope is based on His character.

We hope not because of what we see, but because of who God is.

In life no matter what happens, God calls us to move forward, not stay stuck.

In Philippians 3, Paul writes, "Forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal."

Paul doesn't say the past doesn't matter...

Paul understands that while his past shaped him, it does not define his future. Throughout Scripture we see this same truth echoed again and again: God is always calling His people forward, not based on where they have been, but based on where He is leading them. Abraham was told, "Go to the land I will show you," though he had no map. Moses was commanded, "Lead My people out," though he had no assurance other than God's promise to be with him. The disciples were invited simply, "Follow Me," without a full explanation of what that journey would demand.

What defined all of these moments was not certainty, but faith; not comfort, but obedience; not nostalgia for the past, but hope in God's unfolding future. Each of them had a history, but their identity and purpose were defined by God's call forward. And so it is with us ... God is not finished writing our story. The same God who called Abraham, Moses, and the disciples is still calling us to move forward in trust, believing that what lies ahead in Christ is far greater than anything left behind.

Remember, God's future is already in motion. Even when we don't see it, God is working. Even when we feel stuck, God is preparing new things. The God we worship is not the God of "what was," but the God of "what is to come."

So, you might be thinking..... what does this mean for us today? It means that if you are in a season of waiting, God is not absent...God is at work behind the scenes, preparing the path ahead. If you are feeling discouraged or overwhelmed, remember that this moment is not the end of your story ... God is still writing, and greater things are yet to come. And if you find yourself in a place of joy and blessing, know that what you are experiencing now is only a small taste of the fullness of joy God

has planned for you. In every season of waiting, struggling, or celebrating know that God is moving us forward toward His promise.

Remember, Hope is not pretending everything will be easy in the future. Hope is knowing that whatever comes next, God will be in it.

As Christians, we don't just look back at what Christ did, as powerful as that is, we look forward to what Christ will do.

New opportunities. New mercies. New life.

God always gives us something to look forward to.

So let us live not with fear or regret, but with expectation.

Because with God, the best is yet to come! Amen.
