**SCRIPTURE READING:** Matthew 28:1–10

New International Version

Jesus Has Risen

**28** After the Sabbath, at dawn on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb.

<sup>2</sup> There was a violent earthquake, for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and, going to the tomb, rolled back the stone and sat on it. <sup>3</sup> His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow. <sup>4</sup> The guards were so afraid of him that they shook and became like dead men.

<sup>5</sup> The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. <sup>6</sup> He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. <sup>7</sup> Then go quickly and tell his disciples: 'He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him.' Now I have told you." <sup>8</sup> So the women hurried away from the tomb, afraid yet filled with joy, and ran to tell his disciples. <sup>9</sup> Suddenly Jesus met them. "Greetings," he said. They came to him, clasped his feet and worshiped him. <sup>10</sup> Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me."

# **REFLECTION:** "The Sun Rises"

Jesus has taught us to try to achieve a loving life. I believe that and Jesus is our example of that. Jesus was always serving, teaching, healing, blessing, and challenging the world around him. He was always placing his faith ahead of him and placed his faith in God to lead him to where he is needed.

And now, after his crucifixion and moving into his enlightened and resurrected state, his message of new possibilities of challenging the world is even more profound.

Sometimes, when we look at things in our lives, we can look at them not just for their physical qualities and endurance but also with our spiritual

eyes to receive a new vision of what the world was, is, and can become. The challenge then becomes for us to take that spiritual vision and make it be so for the betterment of all of us to live together. The challenge becomes uniting this spiritual vision with the will to be Christlike and show the world what it means to follow Christ, be like Christ and believe in Christ.

"Do not be afraid," Jesus tells the mourning followers. And this is what Jesus tells us today: do not be afraid. I like to add what I think Jesus would say to us today as we isolate in this time of COVID-19... Do not be afraid... God and creation is with you because God made in each one of you. Take for example the birds in the sky...an eagle... as I was walking the other day, I watched an eagle soaring in the sky, letting the wind lift it up to greater heights I thought so will God our Creator, he will lift you in ways that you never knew possible. Look for that miracle and be thankful. But don't just look for it with your eyes; look for it also with your heart. The answer is there. Share it with all the people, with of all of creation, because we are all made of God. "Do not be afraid". I say to all you, believers in the Risen Lord, may you take the celebration of this Easter day and let it warm your heart and soul just as the sun gives you warmth on your back, and energy for a new tomorrow. Embrace the words "He is Risen" for Christ is with us on our journeys of life, on that path that sometimes can be rough, dark, cold, and a challenge. But as a community of spiritual faith, we are not alone because we live in God's world. The sun will always rise to bring us back to life each day. That is the blessing we receive from God, from the Holy Spirit and from the Son. Do not be afraid, our new day has just begun on this Easter morning. Thanks be to God. Amen.
