CHILDREN'S STORY- What's in a Name?

This morning I want you to think about your name. Were you named after your mother of your father? Do you like your name? Does the meaning of you name reflect your personality? Would you change your name if you could?

I found this little bit of History on origin of names very interesting and so I share it with you.

Many of us have surnames passed down to us from ancestors in England. Last names weren't widely used until after the Norman conquest in 1066, but as the country's population grew, people found it necessary to be more specific when they were talking about somebody else. Thus arose descriptions like Thomas the Baker, Norman son of Richard, Henry the Whitehead, Elizabeth of the Field, and Joan of York that, ultimately, led to many of our current surnames.

There are perhaps 45,000 different English surnames, but most had their origins as one of these seven types.

Occupational

Occupational names identified people based on their job or position in society. Calling a man "Thomas Carpenter" indicated that he worked

with wood for a living, while someone named Knight bore a sword. Other occupational names include Archer, Baker, Brewer, Butcher, Carter, Clark, Cooper, Cook, Dyer, Farmer, Faulkner, Fisher, Fuller, Gardener, Glover, Head, Hunt or Hunter, Judge, Mason, Page, Parker, Potter, Sawyer, Slater, Smith, Taylor, Thatcher, Turner, Weaver, Woodman, and Wright (or variations such as Cartwright and Wainwright) — and there are many more.

This kind of name also gave a clue about whom a servant worked for. Someone named Vickers might have been a servant to Mr. Vicker, and someone named Williams might either have served a William or been adopted by him.

From a geographical feature of the landscape

Some examples are Bridge, Brooks, Bush, Camp, Fields, Forest, Greenwood, Grove, Hill, Knolles, Lake, Moore, Perry, Stone, Wold, Wood, and Woodruff. Author Margaret Atwood is probably descended from someone who lived "at the wood."

Jesus was walking one day with his friends. He was curious about what people thought of him. He asked his friends "Who do people say that I am". Some said the prophet Elijah, others that he might actually be Moses. But Simon said that Jesus was the Christ, the son of the Living God. That was true! Jesus was not Elijah or Moses or any other prophet — he is God's Son. Jesus said that it took courage to say that and he told Simon that he would now be called Peter — the rock — the strong one. The rock won't be destroyed. He would rely on Peter to tell others and help others, just like Jesus did.

A Living Sacrifice to God

12 And so, dear brothers and sisters, [a] I plead with you to give your bodies to God because of all he has done for you. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice—the kind he will find acceptable. This is truly the way to worship him. [b] ² Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. Then you will learn to know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and perfect.

³Because of the privilege and authority^[c] God has given me, I give each of you this warning: Don't think you are better than you really are. Be honest in your evaluation of yourselves, measuring yourselves by the faith God has given us.^{[d] 4} Just as our bodies have many parts and each part has a special function, ⁵ so it is with Christ's body. We are many parts of one body, and we all belong to each other.

⁶ In his grace, God has given us different gifts for doing certain things well. So if God has given you the ability to prophesy, speak out with as much faith as God has given you. ⁷ If your gift is serving others, serve them well. If you are a teacher, teach well. ⁸ If your gift is to encourage others, be encouraging. If it is giving, give generously. If God has given you leadership ability, take the responsibility seriously. And if you have a gift for showing kindness to others, do it gladly.

Peter's Declaration about Jesus

¹³ When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" [a]

¹⁴ "Well," they replied, "some say John the Baptist, some say Elijah, and others say Jeremiah or one of the other prophets."

¹⁵ Then he asked them, "But who do you say I am?"

¹⁶ Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, [b] the Son of the living God."

¹⁷ Jesus replied, "You are blessed, Simon son of John, ^[c] because my Father in heaven has revealed this to you. You did not learn this from any human being. ¹⁸ Now I say to you that you are Peter (which means

MESSAGE– Moving Forward as One Body

Today I thought I would reflect on the passage from Romans a passage that we all know very well. Paul is talking to the followers about the fact that we are all parts of the one body, We all have many talents and we are to use them for the glory of God. As I'm out walking this morning and I'm thinking that this, I started thinking that it has been a very hard 5 months for many people in many different ways. And for the church it's been something that never happened in history. With all the world wars and all the events that have happened before including major viruses, the Depression and other world events the church has never closed its doors.

And these thoughts that I'm sharing with you, come from my heart, observations that I have listened to and heard from other people. In all of this, I do want to uplift and praise what the church has been in the last 5 months. We live in an age of technology and I thank God for that. After the first week of no worship service myself and many, many other ministers, pastors, lay people started streaming messages through online Worship, emailed Sunday services, created YouTube channels and were able to reach their congregations and beyond. Also, within that live streaming the opportunity arose to play old hymns, new worship music, new artists, old artists to help you celebrate God's presence in your lives. And going farther and beyond that, I know that God was working in you and through you because each of you were supporting each other in many different ways. Through phone calls, dropping off food at people's door steps, supporting one another by emails, sending cards and letters, Tuesday morning coffee chats and Facebook pages. I can honestly say, even though the church doors closed God did not go on vacation. He was present in each and every one of your lives. The Dynamics for each person and situation may have been different but the

spirit of God was within your homes, within your work places, within these times of uncertainty, God was there.

As we prepare to reopen our doors, we know that things won't be the same because of the rules that had been laid out that we have to follow. In saying that, we will still worship,uplifting praise, uplifting thankfulness and celebrating God's presence in our world. We are all parts of the body of Christ asPaul tells us that "...even as we have many members in one body, and all the members don't have the same function", "so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another".

Being a part of God's family is like being a part of a stained glass window. We each have an important gift that is needed to fit into the frame of the church. We may have the ability to teach or lead or minister to others. We may have the gift of caring and cheerfulness and be able to give encouragement. Your gift is special and is just for you. Finding and using your special gift is an adventure that helps you understand "what is the will of God" for your life.

When our individual gifts are combined with the gifts of other Christians, we have the ability to make something very beautiful. God's light transforms us, just like sunlight causes our stained glass windows to sparkle and glow.

Remember that God is present in everything we do, everything we see and through our voices as we share. Amen
