The Ascension of Jesus

⁶ So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷ He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has fixed by his own authority. ⁸ But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea

and Samar'ia and to the end of the earth." ⁹ And when he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰ And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, ¹¹ and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

Do you ever get lost in a daydream? Maybe you are sitting somewhere,

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at the doctor's office or maybe just sitting at home and you start to drift off to somewhere else. I confess that I find myself daydreaming a lot lately. I will sit there and think about things I have to do later, places I would much rather be, and I even dream about events in the past Why do we daydream? Daydreaming assists us in making moral decisions. It also gives us an outlet to plan as well as problem-solving in a safe space. Or when we don't want to be where we are and so we dream about being somewhere else, someplace better. The disciples in our story from Acts this morning weren't exactly daydreaming. They had witnessed with their own eyes Jesus ascending to the clouds. They were witnesses to his resurrection and now were witnesses to his ascension. Jesus disappeared into the clouds, back to the presence of God and the disciples stared at the sky. Jesus told them that he would be coming back, did the disciples really think it would be so soon. Jesus would pop back out as soon as he left. The disciples did not want to leave that moment and so they stood there staring at the sky. For the disciples, this chapter of their lives was now over. For the last three years the disciples followed Jesus and engaged in ministry with Jesus. They left their families, houses, and jobs to follow Jesus and now that journey was over, but a new journey was about to begin. Then two angels appeared in the sky where they were looking. "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." In other word the angels were saying okay we understand you want Jesus to return but Jesus wants you to carry on "You've got work to do and there is no time like the present to get started." Jesus completed his work on earth, at least for the time being and now it was the disciples turn to proclaim the good news to the poor.

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Jesus will return in the same way that you saw him leave, but until then you've got work to do. Let's just step back to the disciples staring up to heaven... pausing at this moment in time.

Why did the disciples want to linger in that moment? Why did they want to stay there and daydream? We can ask ourselves that question. One reason is that they wanted things to return to the way they were before. They thought that when they saw that Jesus had been resurrected they would go back to what they were doing before, preaching the gospel and helping those in need. That was comfortable, that was familiar, and that was easy. It was what they were use to. The disciples were afraid of what was going to happen...things were going to change. We know all about that don't we? In life we struggle with change... sometimes we feel that it is easier if things stay the same. Because it is familiar, it is comfortable, and it is easy. But change has come to us in last months that we didn't expect. Our churches closed. And questions were coming at us in all directions. How can we be the church if we do not have Sunday morning worship, not shaking hands, not hugging, not eating together, how do we support our community, our needy, our homeless....the list goes on...what do we do now! Do you see similarly to the disciples who have just lost their leader,

Do you see similarly to the disciples who have just lost their leader, Jesus who has just descended into heaven... were uncertain of what was going to come.

All of this sudden change has made me do a lot of discerning about where God is leading me as your minister. Where God is leading you the members of his church in ministry and how do we hold on to our faith? And now I am going to answer my own question.....by what we are doing now... caring for each other, sharing the online worship services and bulletins with others, being Christ like in our everyday lives. All of a sudden, it's no longer the Sunday morning worship (even though at this point in time they are truly missed) that gives shape to worship, but the relationships we have from our churches and the relationships we are forming in a virtual way. Those relationships include both person-to-person and person-to-divine relationships. In Romans 8:28 it states...And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose.

So in this time of doubt remember that God makes all things new, not all things like they were before. God is always looking forward into the

present and the future, into what is now and what will be in the future. I truly believe we will be living in this world differently from this moment on. However, there is good news. The future that God has in store for us will be different but still amazing. Christ will return to us in the same way that he ascended to the Father and that is with power, grace, and glory.

But....We cannot spend our lives as Christians with our heads in the clouds, daydreaming about the past. We have to be proactive. We have to pull together. We have to keep going. Being disciples of Jesus in a troubled and uncertain world. We may never achieve 100 % unity, but if we work toward it, we will be going in the right direction. If we stand together, we can withstand all the elements the world throws at us, so we can continue being disciples, followers and leaders in Christ's name.
