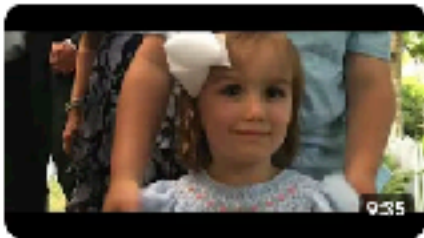

VCCS is the latest update to the Vidalia on-call reporting system. Vidaliens can report incidents to the VCCS call center which will activate the Town of Vidalia on call technicians.



VCCS is the new on-call reporting system for Vidaliens to inform our crew of any incidents (i.e. water leaks, power outages, unusual air quality, etc.) around town.

The Cooperative Communication System will allow citizens to:

- Receive text message notifications from the Town
- Report incidents and service issues in their area
- After-hours, on-call access to the LIVE VCCS Agent

Simply call **318-414-1860** and the VCCS Agent will create a work ticket to ensure our team has the necessary information to address the situation.

In the case of an emergency, please call 911.

NATCHEZ — The 3rd Annual Natchez Day of Unity celebration kicked off Juneteenth's week full of events on Tuesday.

Annually held at the Bandstand on the bluff overlooking the Mississippi River, the Unity Day celebration was relocated indoors due to a heat advisory. It was hosted at First Presbyterian Church on Pearl Street in Downtown Natchez by the invitation of the Rev. Joan Gandy.

Caroline Curtis Deason was emcee for the event. Her late husband, the Rev. Kevin Deason of New Direction Outreach Ministries, was honored with a key to the city in 2020 by Day of Unity host Dan M. Gibson, mayor of the City of Natchez.

Gibson opened the ceremony with a message of "Unity in our Community." Gibson quoted Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. who said, "Hate is too great a burden to bear."

He went on to say community and unity are the keys to future success in Natchez.

## DUSTIN HINKLE FEATURED IN LOCAL MEDIA: THE NATCHEZ DEMOCRAT

VIDALIA, La. – After years spent working on small personal art projects for friends and family around the community, local artist Jenny Hinkle decided to open Miss-Lou Studio Creative.

"At first, my husband and I just needed a larger studio," Hinkle said, "The projects that we started getting asked to do were too large for the studio we were in at the time. But after getting an offer on this building I knew that I could do more with it, create a place for anyone who wanted to learn art."

The studio is located at 3046-C Carter St. in Vidalia.

After hosting her first class in March, Hinkle quickly began expanding the topics that she taught. She now offers a number of different lessons, such as classes in visual art, and website design, as well as an array of classes she calls "create," such as illustrate create, doodle create, and sketch create. She hopes that in the near future, she will be able to teach new classes, such as digital animation, while also continuing to progress in her present classes.

Another aspect that she hopes to be able to introduce to her studio is a cooking class, hosted by her daughter Hannah Hinkle, owner of "Rollin' in the Dough" which is a sweets shop located right next door to the studio. Through collaboration and progress, Hinkle wants to create an environment where anyone can come in and create on their own accord, not restrained by instruction or pressure.

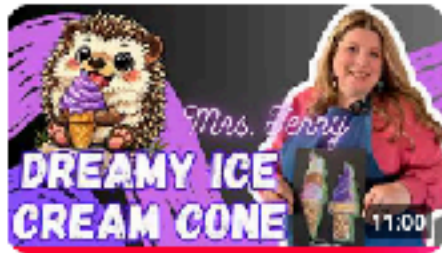

# DESIGN RECOGNITION IN LOCAL MEDIA: LISTEN UP YA'LL MEDIA

**NATCHEZ, Miss.** — A new brochure telling the story of Prince Abdul Rahman Ibrahima (1762-1829) — and mapping key sites tied to his life in Natchez and Adams County — is now available free to the public.

The publication, titled “Prince Ibrahima: A Profile and Self-Guided Tour,” was produced by Visit Natchez and funded by a \$2,111 mini-grant awarded in 2024 by the Mississippi Humanities Council.

“The Mississippi Humanities Council is pleased to support this project that highlights one of Mississippi’s most remarkable stories,” said Dr. Stuart Rockoff, director of the Mississippi Humanities Council. “This brochure is part of Natchez’s ongoing effort to uplift its full history and challenge simplistic or incomplete accounts of its past.”

The pocket-sized tour guide features a biographical profile of Ibrahima, along with a list of key sites tied to his life in Natchez and Adams County, including places he visited and related gravesites. A map and photographs of the selected sites are included.

The brochure was designed by Dustin Hinkle of Open Market Design Company and printed by Catherine Murray of Murray Printing.

Lynsey Gilbert, interim director of Visit Natchez, said she and her staff are excited about the publication, as are many others in the community.

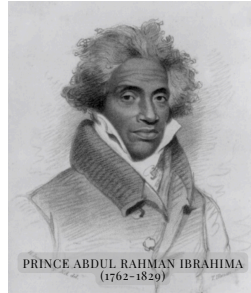

**PRINCE IBRAHIMA:**  
A PROFILE AND SELF-GUIDED TOUR

Discover the extraordinary story of Prince Abdul Rahman Ibrahima (1762-1829), an African prince who spent 40 years enslaved on a plantation near Natchez, Mississippi, before gaining his freedom in 1828.

See the place of his enslavement near Washington in Adams County and the places he visited in Natchez.

Use this tour guide to visit the sites that played a pivotal role in his life!



In his letter, written in 1826, Ibrahima wrote a passage from the Quran. Marschalk took it and added a cover letter addressed to U.S. Senator Thomas B. Reed of Natchez, who took the letter to Washington, D.C. The letter eventually made its way to Thomas Mulwony, the U.S. consul in Tangier, Morocco, who shared it with an official of Moroccan Sultan Abd al-Rahman II. The sultan said Ibrahima must be freed and he would pay any price to see him returned home. Mulwony shared the sultan's sentiment and expressed it in a letter to Washington, D.C.

Marschalk had mistakenly written that Ibrahima was a Moor and a member of the royal family of Morocco. Ibrahima did not contact him. The communications eventually involved U.S. Secretary of State Henry Clay in President John Quincy Adams' administration. Clay authorized Marschalk's efforts to obtain Ibrahima's freedom. The U.S. government had agreed to cover the expenses to send the prince to West Africa.

**Free at Last!**  
On Friday, February 22, 1828, Foster delivered Ibrahima to Marschalk's printing office along with a deed in trust for Ibrahima. "Thomas signed the deed and left the office," wrote Ibrahima's biographer, Terry Alford. Ibrahima was 66. Isabella's freedom would be purchased later for \$200.

On April 8, 1828, Ibrahima and Isabella traveled with their family to the dock under the hill. They boarded the Neptune steamship and waved goodbye to their children, who remained enslaved. For several months after leaving Natchez, Ibrahima traveled to Washington, D.C., and Connecticut, among other places, on a fundraising campaign to help free his children. However, he came up short.

**Sailing to West Africa**  
In February 1829, he and Isabella sailed to Monrovia, Liberia, which the American Colonization Society had created as a home for formerly enslaved Africans. During their stay in Liberia, Ibrahima contracted a disease and died on July 6, 1829, at the age of 67. He never reached his homeland in Futa Jallon. Isabella remained in Liberia. Two of her sons, one with a wife and five children, later joined her.

**THE REMARKABLE STORY OF PRINCE IBRAHIMA**

Abdul Rahman Ibrahima was a Muslim prince, and according to himself, was born in 1762 in Timbuktu, a city in the current African country of Mali. Ibrahima grew up in Timbo, Guinea, West Africa. His father, Ibrahima Sori, was a king who ruled as a political and religious leader in the Futa Jallon highlands of Guinea.

Ibrahima was only 26 when he served as a colonel in his father's army. However, his military service was cut short. In 1788, he and his soldiers were returning home to celebrate a victory after a battle when they were ambushed by the Hebohs, a rival, non-Muslim, ethnic group. Ibrahima was captured and sold to slave traders.

**Sold to Thomas Foster**  
Ibrahima arrived in Natchez in August 1788 by boat at the site that is known as Silver Street, Under-the-Hill. From there, he and his friend, Samba, who served with him in the military, were purchased by a farmer named Thomas Foster for \$900. Ibrahima initially resisted his new life, but over time, he proved to be a good worker and became an overseer at Foster's plantation.

In 1791, Foster purchased a woman in her early 20s named Isabella. She and Ibrahima married on Christmas Day of 1794. The two of them would raise nine children: five sons and four daughters. In 1802, the prince met newspaper editor and printer Andrew Marschalk, who is today known as the "Father of Mississippi Journalism." He would play a significant role in Ibrahima's life.

**Recognizing Dr. Cox**  
In 1807, the prince visited the market in Washington to sell sweet potatoes when he saw Dr. John Coates Cox, a friend from his past. Cox, an Irishman, had sailed to West Africa in 1781. After going ashore to hunt, he became lost and later collapsed. He was rescued by the Fulani people of Futa Jallon and taken to Timbo, where Ibrahima's father cared for him.

After Ibrahima and Cox recognized each other in Mississippi, the doctor tried for many years to buy his freedom, but Foster refused to release him. Cox died in December 1816. His chance meeting with Ibrahima generated fame for both of them. The fame eventually led to Ibrahima's freedom with the help of Marschalk.

**Letter-writing Campaign**  
In the early 1820s, Ibrahima began visiting Marschalk's print shop, which was right beside Marschalk's home on the northeast corner of Wall and Franklin streets in downtown Natchez. On one of his visits, Ibrahima picked up a book and read the text that was printed in Arabic, which surprised Marschalk. Later, Ibrahima expressed an interest in writing a letter to his home country, and Marschalk agreed to help him. However, it would be a few years later before Ibrahima would write the letter.

**1 SILVER STREET, UNDER-THE-HILL**

The area known as Under-the-Hill, where the loading dock leads up to Silver Street, is where Ibrahima arrived in Natchez as an enslaved man in August 1788. This is also the place where Ibrahima and his wife, Isabella, departed Natchez in 1828 with their freedom. It was from this location that they boarded the Neptune steamboat and waved goodbye to their children, who remained enslaved.

**2 FORT ROSALIE**

Prince Ibrahima arrived in Natchez in August 1788. "It was here that Thomas Foster purchased Ibrahima and Samba in an agreement signed at the fort in the presence of Don Carlos de Grand-Pre, civil and Military commandant of the [Natchez] District," (Dr. Terry Alford) the site where this transaction took place is Fort Rosalie (called Fort Plaquemine by the British, pictured here between Green and Canal streets). Historical panels in this area provide much information about the fort and its history.

**3 ANDREW MARSCHALK'S HOME AND PRINTING OFFICE**

Andrew Marschalk was a newspaper publisher. This building, which no longer exists, was located at the northeast corner of North Wall and Franklin streets. It is where Ibrahima met with Marschalk and read from a book with text in Arabic. Marschalk initiated efforts that resulted in Ibrahima's freedom. Images courtesy of the Ibrahima Natchez Foundation.

**4 GRAVE OF ANDREW MARSCHALK**

Andrew Marschalk helped to secure the freedom of Prince Ibrahima and his wife, Isabella, in 1828. Marschalk's grave is located at Natchez City Cemetery at 2 Cemetery Road near the far southwestern corner of the old part of the cemetery. (Plot # 4264) Call the cemetery for details: 601-445-9051.

**5 GRAVE OF DR. JOHN COATES COX**

Dr. John Coates Cox tried for years to purchase Prince Ibrahima's freedom but without success. His grave is located at Natchez Cemetery at 2 Cemetery Road near the far southwestern corner of the old part of the cemetery. (Plot # 4298) Call the cemetery for details: 601-445-9051.

**6 HOME OF THOMAS BUCK REED**

U.S. Senator Thomas B. Reed (1787-1829) was the person who received Prince Ibrahima's letter with the cover letter by Andrew Marschalk and delivered it to the U.S. State Department in Washington, D.C. Reed owned this home from 1818 to 1829. Today, the house is known as Under-the-Hill Red-and-White. It is located at 1 Corner Circle. Photo taken from Biographical Directory of the U.S. Congress. **7 SALEM CHURCH MARKER**

Pine Ridge Presbyterian Church organized in 1807 as Salem Church. It is located at DR. M.L.K. Jr. Road and Airport Road. The original building no longer exists. Ibrahima reportedly visited the church with the Foster family.

**8 GRAVES OF THOMAS FOSTER SR. AND HIS DAUGHTER, CASSANDRA FOSTER SPEED**

Prince Ibrahima arrived in Natchez in August 1788. "It was here that Thomas Foster purchased Ibrahima and Samba in an agreement signed at the fort in the presence of Don Carlos de Grand-Pre, civil and Military commandant of the [Natchez] District," (Dr. Terry Alford) the site where this transaction took place is Fort Rosalie (called Fort Plaquemine by the British, pictured here between Green and Canal streets). **9 HISTORIC JEFFERSON COLLEGE**

It was in this area between 16 Old North St. and Highway 61 North in Washington that Prince Ibrahima recognized Dr. John Coates Cox in 1807 at the market place. NATCHEZ — An artistic couple from Natchez's latest project from their graphic design business has really taken wing, as the new honeybee design will soon be popping up on Mississippi driver's license plates.

Dustin and Jenny Hinkle's graphic design business, Open Market Design Co., created the design for Magnolia Honeybee Education Exchange (MHBee) to promote the preservation of pollinator habitats through education, forming beekeeper alliances and outfitting upcoming beekeepers with gear and equipment.

"People have already been lining up for their bee tags," Jenny Hinkle said, adding it's the first-ever license plate of its kind for the Magnolia State. "It's a fun stamp in our creative portfolio. It's always fun to see your art go out into the wild, and now on a state license plate."

Proceeds from the sale of the license plate support Magnolia Honeybee Education Exchange's honeybee education efforts.

Hinkle said she and Dustin partnered with beekeeper turned digital creator Randy McCaffrey, also known as the 628 Dirt Rooster on YouTube, and his wife, Elizabeth McCaffrey, from Gulfport to create the new plate design. McCaffrey gained YouTube popularity by filming himself moving unwanted honeybee swarms to safer locations, Hinkle said.
