BOOKMOBILE







In 2024, the library partnered with the Friends of the Library to purchase a bookmobile and have it wrapped (as seen above). According to the American Library Association, "Bookmobiles and direct-delivery outreach services are, and continue to be an integral, vital part of libraries around the country. For over 100 years bookmobiles have served rural, urban, suburban and tribal areas, bringing access to information and life-long learning resources to all classes and communities". The bookmobile allows the library to provide services to local assisted living homes and homebound individuals. Some of the bookmobile stops are: Villago Lake, Val Vista RV Resort, Foothills West RV Resort, Community Rec Center, Big House Christian Academy, Dave White Park, Seeds of Hope, and many, more!

ANNUAL BOOK SALE

The Friends of the Library maintain daily book sale shelves at both Vista Library and the Main Library.

We also host an annual "book sale" with thousands of books at various locations provided to us by the community or Friends members. The book sale funds raised from our booksales are used 100% to support library programs and events.













ANNUAL OVERDRIVE SUBSCRIPTION





"Just as diversity should not be a bonus or an option but should comprise the essence and the core of our professional activities and decisions, non-print formats should not be a bonus or an afterthought either. 2024 Overdrive checkouts = 113,047

Of those 9,762 were on our Advantage titles sponsored by the Friends of the Library. At \$30 average price per piece (low), this equals \$292,286 saved by not having to buy the CD audiobooks.
