

Message from the Pastor

GOT IT ALL FIGURED OUT

Sam had it all figured out. To surprise his wife for their 20th anniversary, he planned a special trip to the Grand Canyon. Four days of hiking, horse-back riding, fishing, and camping. No phones phones, no kids, no hectic activity. He picked up his wife and talked her into taking a nap while he drove to their 'getaway'. He told her

to be ready for a big surprise.

Amy had her heart set on a cruise (which she had strongly hinted at in the previous weeks). She wanted pampering, relaxing and being served. She went to sleep with



dreams of gourmet dinners, ocean strolls and massages from a 200 lb. Swedish masseuse named Helga. She woke up to chuck-wagon beans, dusty trails and a 300 lb. mule named Gus. Sam had it all figured out alright—except what was most important! Sam planned the perfect vacation for https://disabs/high.nih.gov/ but he never considered what Amy might want.

How similar that is in so many ways to our relationship with God. We think we've got it all figured out, but often we haven't really noticed, appreciated or sought the things God wants for us and from us. Take our world for example.

We understand how our world functions. We corral diseases and transplant hearts. We master the oceans and send probes to space. We map DNA and code nuclei. We study systems and learn how they work. We've got it all figured out.

Then God says, "Who then is like Me? Let him declare it. I am the Lord and there is no other. I form the light and create the darkness. I will strengthen you so that men may know there is none beside Me." Is. 45:5-7 We disappoint the Lord when we see only what

<u>we</u> want to see and not what He has in mind for us. He wants us to marvel at His creation and praise Him with thankful hearts for all He has done for us. Instead, we pat ourselves on the back and credit our discoveries to ourselves. No wonder there is no wonder.

We have discovered so much that we forget the One who set nature in its place in the first place. And, this loss of mystery had led to the loss of majesty. The more we know, the less we believe. Strange, don't you think? Knowledge of the workings shouldn't negate wonder of the Creator. Knowledge should stir wonder. Who has more reason to worship than the astronomer who has seen the stars? Than the surgeon who has held a beating heart? Than the molecular biologist who has seen the chromosome? Than the proud parents of a newborn? The more we know, the more we should be amazed!

Ironically, the more we know, the less we worship. We are more impressed with our discovery of the light bulb than with the One who made light. Rather than worship the <u>Creator</u>, we worship the <u>creation</u>. This was true already in St. Paul's day when he wrote (by God's direction) "For although they knew God [from conscience and creation], they neither glorified Him as God, nor gave thanks to Him...They exchanged the truth of God for a lie and worshiped created things rather than the Creator." Rom. 1:21, 25

I invite you to gather with us any—preferably every—Sunday to worship the Creator. Certainly, you can marvel at the Lord's sunrise from your porch, but you can hear God's own Word at church. Instead of admiring God's handiwork, you can receive his personal assurance at Communion. You can hear Pastor proclaim the wonderful words '*Friend, your sins are forgiven you*'. Jesus solved the mystery of sin—He paid our penalty. For us.

Share the wonder with us! <u>Do it this week</u>. Experience the majesty of God close up. God's got it all figured out!

Every weakness you have is an opportunity for God to show His strength in your life.

My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.
