

Message from the Pastor WELCOME HOME PRODIGAL DAUGHTER

Lacy was a typical 16-year-old teen. Her small-town parents raised her as a Christian and took her to church, but as Lacy got older, they began to have arguments. Her parent's strictness and arguments over music, belly rings, and skirt lengths got too much for Lacy. So she ran away.

She took a bus to the big city and tried to find her 'freedom' there. But soon her money ran out. Then she met someone. This 20-something seemed to love her and care for her. He introduced her to the adult world of drinking, then sex, then drugs. Soon, her 'daddy' wanted her to show him how much she loved him by becoming one of his 'ladies', a prostitute. When she refused, she was raped, beaten, and thrown out.

In desperation, Lacy eventually turned tricks to support her new drug habit. She slept on the streets. After a couple of months, no one would ever recognize her as the same girl. Dark circles shaded her eyes. She was cold, and she was always scared, even though she put up a tough front. She wanted her mommy. But how could she go home? She had told her parents that she hated them and never wanted to see them again.

But there was no place else to go. With the little money she had, she bought a bus ticket back home—if it even was her home. She called home but only got the answering machine. She left this message: "Dad, Mom, it's me. I was wondering about maybe coming home. I'm catching the bus and I should be there about 10:00 tomorrow night. If you're not there I'll just stay on the bus."

The six-hour ride home gave Lacy plenty of time to think. She recalled all the terrible things she had said. Would her parents even want her back? Also, what if they weren't home and missed the message? She rehearsed her apology in her head: "I'm so sorry, Daddy! I know I was wrong Mom. It's all my fault. Can you forgive me?!"

As the bus pulled into the station, the driver announced that they only had a 20-minute stop. 20 minutes to decide her life! Lacy tried to look nice but the bags around the eyes and the dirt of the street couldn't be hidden. As she entered the terminal she only dared to hope.

Her wildest dreams could not have imagined the forty relatives and friends, all wearing party hats, there to shout 'surprise'. The huge sign on the wall reading 'welcome home Lacy' brought a lump to her throat. Then her father came running out of the group and hugged her with the best hug she had ever received.

"I'm so sorry" she began. But Dad stopped her. "I know" he replied. We've already forgiven you; we're just glad you're home. And, we've got a party waiting for you at home."

The prodigal daughter had returned home.

In Jesus' story of the prodigal (lost) son, the boy's father said this when his repentant son came home, "We had to celebrate because this brother [or sister] was dead and is alive again; she was lost and was found." Lk. 15:32

We may not have done what those two young people did, but "we have all gone astray". We are not worthy of God's love. We cannot return 'home' on our own. Jesus had to save us from going to hell. He took our place. Now we are restored again. Heaven has a 'Welcome home' sign with our names on it because of Jesus! That's what we're celebrating Nov. 3rd at 10:00. If you haven't been in church in a while, this is the Sunday. We will have a full house, all sinners of varying degree, hearing WELCOME HOME. We invite you to be one of us.

Something to Think AboutBe Imitators of Jesus in Doing Good

Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers. (Galatians 6:9,10)

Jesus didn't give up

Sometimes in the gospel accounts you can detect a tinge of frustration in Jesus' words, even when—no, especially when!—he's speaking with his closest disciples. For instance, when those disciples once attempted unsuccessfully to cast out a demon, our Savior exclaimed, "You unbelieving and perverse generation, how long shall I stay with you and put up with you?" (Luke 9:41). On the night Judas betrayed him, Peter denied him, and the rest abandoned him, Jesus questioned his snoring supporters indignantly, "Couldn't you men keep watch with me for one hour?" (Matthew 26:40).

Already through the mouth of the prophet Isaiah, our Lord Jesus had vocalized how wearisome the object of his saving work would become. There he lamented, "I have labored in vain; I have spent my strength for nothing at all" (Isaiah 49:4). Do you think Jesus has ever been tempted to quit his job as our Savior? Certainly so!

Despite that frustration, however, Jesus has never given up. He's never submitted his letter of resignation. He's never stopped loving us, forgiving us, saving us, and carrying our burdens. Though tempted to do so, Jesus has never become weary in doing good.

What's stopped him? First and foremost, his love for all people is so unfailing and so flawless. But he also knows that there is great, eternal reward in doing good to others, even if that reward isn't immediately obvious. Jesus understood that, as his words through the prophet indicate: "Yet what is due me is in the LORD's hand, and my reward is with my God" (Isaiah 49:4).

We should not become weary

Like Jesus, we're often tempted to become weary in doing good. Unlike Jesus, we succumb to that temptation all too often and all too easily.

But consider what would happen if Jesus ever quit his job as our Savior and threw in the towel. We'd be finished immediately. Life would consist of nothing but death. Without Jesus working for our good, every blessing would instantly vanish. Thankfully, Jesus hasn't and won't become weary in doing good to us, and that's a promise (*Hebrews 13:5*).

As his dear children, then, neither should we become weary in doing "good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers." True, our service to others might not have the same impact as Jesus' work, but our Savior has called us to serve as his hands and feet, his mouth and eyes in the world. We are Jesus' coworkers. Through us, he comforts others (2Corinthians 1:3,4). Through us, he cares for others (2Corinthians 9:10-15). Through us, he saves others through the gospel (1Corinthians 9:22). Through us, he does good to others. What a thought! What a privilege! What a joy!

So be imitators of Jesus: Don't become weary in doing good, "for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." The fruits are eternal, both for us and for those we are called to serve.
