

Message from the Pastor IF ONLY I WERE A GOOSE

There was once a man who didn't believe in God. He didn't hesitate to let others know how he felt about religion and religious holidays. His wife, however, did believe, and raised their children to have faith in Jesus.

One snowy Christmas Eve, his wife was taking their children to the service in the farming community church in



which they lived. She asked him to come, but he refused. "That story is nonsense!" he said. "Why would God lower Himself to come to Earth as a

"I love it," she stated with the enthusiasm of an eight-year-old with a new puppy.

"Mavis, you haven't seen the room or the other facilities they have here. Just wait..."

"That doesn't have anything to do with it, Pastor" she replied. "Happiness is something you decide on ahead of time. Whether I like my room or not doesn't depend on how the furniture is arranged. It's how I arrange my mind. I already decided to love it. It's a decision I make every morning when I wake up.

I have a choice; I can spend the day in bed recounting the difficulty I have with the parts of my body that no longer work, or I can get out of bed and be thankful for the ones that do. Each day is a gift. And as long as my eyes open, I'll focus on the new day and all the happy memories I've stored away just for this time in my life.

Old age is like a Christmas account at the bank. You withdraw from what you've put in and you share with others. So, my advice would be to deposit a lot of happiness in the bank account of memories. I am still depositing. I'll remember all the Christmases I've had and replay them. I know the greatest gift of all was my Savior Jesus. If He's with me, I'm happy.
