

Message from the Pastor

Keep your Eyes on the Fries

Do you know what the most famous advertising logo in the world is? Pillsbury Dough Boy? Nike swoosh? Colonel Sanders? Nope. The most well recognized logo in the world is a yellow half-circle. You probably know it better as The Golden Arches! Yep, good old McDonalds. Its domain is legendary and long-standing.

But did you know that there was a time in the late 1990's when McDonalds actually lost significant chunks of market share? The dining giant, which had increased its profits for an amazing twenty-eight straight years, actually saw falling sales. The trend continued for several quarters until a new CEO was brought on board. This new CEO almost immediately turned things around. Part of the



turn-around came from new—and health conscious—food offerings. But the biggest part came from the new slogan the CEO developed: Keep your Eyes on the Fries!

Keep your Eyes on the Fries. What did he mean by that? Simply this: do the basics well, get back to your core items and values and things will be fine. And he was right.

You see, McDonalds did surveys that showed their service time had slowed, their food was cold, and their famous fries were perceived as greasy. Keep your eyes on the fries. Get back to basics and do it well.

In the conservative Lutheran Church, we try to keep our eyes on the fries. The main teaching of the Bible is that Jesus Christ died on the cross for sinners. He rose on the third day and ascended into Heaven. Every single person who believes in Him as their Savior, through the work of the Holy Spirit, will spend eternity in Heaven with Jesus. In fancy terms, this is called the doctrine of Justification by Grace through Faith.

Law and Gospel, Sin and Grace. These are the heart and soul of the Bible. Without these, we have only a nice set of guidelines and a 'don't worry, be happy' mentality.

Occasionally I hear people make pointed comments that the church is not keeping up with the times. Sometimes they even accuse the church of being old-

fashioned in its thinking, behind the times with out-of-date value systems and the same-old-same-old message.

McDonalds has added more salads, less fattening entrées, and toys with meals; but their core—burger, fries and a drink—are still the staple of their success. Get away from that, and you have tofu. You see, some things can't be changed. The Bible and its teachings is one of them. Take away Christ, and you have I-anity. Jesus is not a fad. Do you remember Rubiks Cube, CB radios and Cabbage Patch dolls? (I won't ask if you have one tucked away in a closet.) Those were fads. *Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and Today and Forever (Heb. 13:8).*

A fad lasts only a short time. Then it has to be replaced. Always something new. In contrast, we are told, *Your Word O Lord, is eternal. It stands firm in the Heavens. Your faithfulness continues through all generations. (Ps. 119:89-90).* God isn't very trendy. But He is extremely timely. His Word is not new, but it is certainly relevant and current. He is not like a shooting star, brilliant for a few minutes, then gone forever. He was here yesterday, is here now and will be tomorrow and every day after. After all these years, the Word of the Lord stands forever. God's dynamic message of forgiveness still stands supreme; it has the power to save all who repent and believe. Mary treasured all these in her heart. May it be your treasure too! For 2020, make sure you have your eyes on Jesus.

***Something to Think About* GOD'S HAND IN NATURE—The Ichneumon Wasp.**

This creature is very frail looking, as if a small sneeze could blow it to Cleveland. Yet, after it lands on a tree trunk, it begins thumping it like a drummer in a rock band, using its legs as sticks. Its legs are thinner than those of a Daddy Long Legs, less than a human hair. Amazingly, their 4½ inch long legs are actually high-powered expansion drills. It is so long and delicate that it curves up and down as the small insect thumps the



wood with it. (Perhaps a Beatles tune? ‘Come together, right now, over me’!) After a little while (or the tune ends), the creature somehow knows it has found the right spot. Drilling begins. Ichi (he likes that nick-name) uses that delicate feeler to cut its way down through several inches of solid hardwood. To this day, scientists cannot figure out how it can. It just does.

If this weren't enough, the target of the wasp's drill is unique too. It seeks the larvae of a special beetle. How can it possibly know where to start its drill, so as to go straight down and hit the larva dead center? Scientists can't figure that out either. Somehow the initial thumping tells Ichi where the bug is and what kind of bug is there, since it only likes a certain kind. Once the hole is completed, Ichi lays its eggs on just one larva. The hatchlings feed on the larva only until they can still crawl up the shaft. When they finish growing up, without any instructions or examples, they know exactly what to do so the species continues. They just start thumping. Evolution? I think not!

WORLD MISSION NEWS—We have reason for joy; and for great concern. We are so thankful that the new Seminary in Viet Nam is completely funded. Construction is proceeding and new students are being enrolled. The Gospel is being proclaimed to thousands of people in the area. Thanks for all who contributed!...

Bring to the Lord in prayer the situation in China. The message of Jesus is being proclaimed in many areas of China. Because of that, people are adopting different attitudes, similar to what happened in East Germany in the 1980s. The Chinese government is threatened by this. They are trying to root out all ‘Western Influence’ to return to their nationalistic ideology. They don't want direct confrontation (like what is going on in Hong Kong), so they do it by ‘a thousand cuts’. Visas, banking, communications, property rental regs., and zoning restrictions have been used like a boa constrictor to squeeze the church to death. Our private Lutheran school was forced to close this way. Workers and parents alike are being displaced.

The gray zone of yesterday is gone. Work in Beijing is not feasible. Four of ten missionaries in China are being moved out of mainland China, even as we try to find other ways to share Jesus. God will lead us to other ways we pray.

It was then that a bright light shone upon the man and a voice came out of the sky saying:


